

PROPER of the MASS

ST DIDACUS

November 13

Psalm 91: 13,14,2 INTROIT

JUSTUS ut palma florebit: sicut cedrus Libani multiplicabitur: plantatus in domo Domini: in atris domus Dei nostri. *Ps.* Bonum est confiteri Domino: et psallere nomini tuo, Altissime. Gloria Patri.

The just shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall grow up like the cedar of Libanus: planted in the house of the Lord, in the courts of the house of our God. *Ps.* It is good to give praise to the Lord: and to sing to Thy name, O Most High. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

OMNÍPOTENS sempitérne Deus, qui dispositióne mirábili infirma mundi éligis, ut fórtia quæque confúndas, concéde propítius humilitáti nostræ; ut, piis beáti Dídaci Confessóris tui précibus, ad perénnem in cælis glóriam sublimari mereámur. Per Dóminum.

Almighty, eternal God, Who, in Thy wonderful providence, dost choose the weak things of the world to confound the strong: mercifully grant unto our lowliness that, by the prayers of blessed Didacus, Thy Confessor. Through our Lord.

I Corinthians 4: 9-14 EPISTLE

FRATRES: Spectaculum facti sumus mundo, et Angelis, et hominibus. Nos stulti propter Christum, vos autem prudentes in Christo: nos infirmi, vos autem fortes: vos nobiles, nos autem ignobiles. Usque in hanc horam et esurimus, et sitimus, et nudi sumus, et colaphis cædimur, et instabiles sumus, et laboramus operantes manibus nostris: maledicimur, et benedicimus: persecutionem patimur, et sustinemus; blasphemamur, et obsecramus: tamquam purgamenta hujus mundi facti sumus, omnium peripsema usque adhuc. Non ut confundam vos, hæc scribo, sed ut filios meos carissimos moneo: in Christo Jesu Domino nostro.

Brethren, we are made a spectacle to the world, and to Angels, and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ: we are weak, but you are strong: you are honourable, but we without honour. Even unto this hour we both hunger and thirst, and are naked, and are buffeted and have no fixed abode, and we labour, working with our hands: we are reviled, and we bless: we are persecuted, and we suffer it: we are blasphemed, and we entreat: we are made as the refuse of this world, the offscouring of all even until now. I write not these things to confound you, but I admonish you as my dearest children: in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Psalm 36: 30-31 GRADUAL

OS JUSTI meditabitur sapientiam, et lingua ejus loquentur judicium. Lex Dei ejus in corde ipsius: et non supplantabuntur gressus ejus.

The mouth of the just shall meditate wisdom, and his tongue shall speak judgment. The law of His God is in his heart: and his steps shall not be supplanted.

Psalm 111: 1 ALLELUIA

ALLELUIA, alleluia. Beatus vir, qui timet Dominum: in mandatis ejus cupit nimis. Alleluia.

Alleluia, alleluia. Blessed is the man that feareth the Lord: he shall delight exceedingly in His commandments. Alleluia.

Luke 12: 32-34 GOSPEL

IN illo tempore: Dixit Jesus discipulis suis: Nolite timere, pusillus grex, quia complacuit Patri vestro dare vobis regnum. Vendite quae possidetis, et date eleemosynam. Facite vobis sacculos, qui non veterascunt, thesaurum non deficientem in caelis: quo fur non appropriat, neque tinea corrumpit. Ubi enim thesaurus vester est, ibi et cor vestrum erit.

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Fear not, little flock, for it hath pleased your Father to give you a kingdom. Sell what you possess, and give alms. Make to yourselves bags which grow not old, a treasure in Heaven which faileth not: where no thief approacheth, nor moth corrupteth. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

Psalm 20: 2-3 OFFERTORY

IN virtute tua, Domine letabitur justus, et super salutare tuum exultabit vehementer: desiderium animae ejus tribuisti ei.

In Thy strength, O Lord, the just man shall joy, and in Thy salvation he shall rejoice exceedingly: Thou hast given him his heart's desire.
