## Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

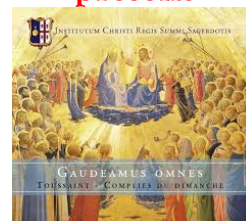

## Feast of Christ the King

The feast of Christ the King comes towards the end of the liturgical year, before the feasts of All Saints and All Souls. This, in itself, teaches us that Christ is King and Lord over Heaven and purgatory, and also over the earth and the whole universe. His kingship is a kingship of truth, justice and love, and is unlike the sovereignty of any earthly monarch,

which is temporal and passing. His kingship lasts for ever. It is a kingship of minds and hearts, as well as bodies, borders and countries. We pray in the Our Father 'Thy Kingdom come'. When we pray this prayer, perhaps we should reflect where Christ's kingdom and the Gospel needs to have a greater influence upon our lives, because 'Thy kingdom come' means 'my kingdom go'.

# The Teaching Of St. Thomas Aquinas On The Eucharist

Notes On The Faith Talk 23<sup>rd</sup> October Given By Canon Montjean

The Summa Theologica, written in Latin in 1485 for beginners in theology, is structured in a logical order that was standard for a university thesis of its day. Each part contains specific questions about a point of faith, the scope of each question becoming subsequently more specific. Usually the answer to the proposed question will be no surprise, however by means of arguments for and against his position, St. Thomas 'unfolds' the reason behind The Faith. St. Thomas was not adverse to questioning even his own conclusions.

## Article 1 Whether the Eucharist is a sacrament.

Of specific interest in this section is St Thomas' justification of the Eucharist as a sacrament by quoting from Sacred Liturgy – the post communion collect, ***“May this Thy sacrament not make us deserving of punishment.”***

By quoting from the liturgy, St. Thomas underlines the fact that the Sacred Liturgy has the authority of the Church.

Lex orandi

Lex credendi – the law of prayer is the law of Faith. This also holds true the other way round, in that the way you pray will affect your faith. The liturgy expresses the authority of the magisterium and any change will have an impact on faith. An example of this can be seen at the consecration prayers of the Chalice – the 'Mystery of Faith' **Mysterium Fidei**. The core of our Faith is expressed in this prayer



**“FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL TESTAMENT, THE MYSTERY OF FAITH; WHICH SHALL BE SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY UNTO THE REMISSION OF SINS.”**

**Article 3 Whether the Eucharist is necessary for salvation.** In answering this question St. Thomas draws a parallel analogy between the natural life of the body and the spiritual life. It is these analogies that set St. Thomas apart from his contemporaries. The sacraments thus could be said to follow our life cycle with conception and birth corresponding to baptism, sustenance – the Eucharist, healing – confession, maturity – confirmation, family – marriage and ordination and finally death – extreme unction.

Just as we need food to sustain and nourish our bodies we need the Eucharist to feed us spiritually. St. Thomas' use of the term 'spiritual food' thus combines the images in the analogy. However “this sacrament is not necessary for salvation in the same way as Baptism is” *To be continued.....* Next faith talk 20<sup>th</sup> November

PRESS RELEASE FROM THE NATIONAL CHURCHES' TRUST

TOP CHURCH BUILDINGS SHORTLISTED FOR ARCHITECTURE AWARDS

The shortlists for the 2018 Church Architecture Awards have been announced.

Winning entries will be revealed at an awards ceremony to be held at St Mellitus College, London SW5 on Thursday, 1 November 2018.. Prince Nicholas von Preussen will announce the 2018 winner

of the King of Prussia Gold Medal 2018 SHORTLIST

Six projects have been shortlisted for the 2018 King of Prussia Gold Medal for church repair and conservation architecture.

They include spire repairs to the church of St Jude, Kensington, London (now occupied by St Mellitus Theological College) 15 tonnes of which had weathered away over the lifetime of the spire; roof repairs to Ss Peter, Paul and St Philomena's church New Brighton, Liverpool, a project which faced many

challenges due to the then innovative use of reinforced concrete when the church was built in 1933 and conservation and repair work to St Mary Magdalene Church, Paddington, London, a project which has brought back to life the architectural and decorative quality of this Gothic Revival masterpiece.

The winning architect will receive the King of Prussia Gold Medal, the gift of King Frederick William IV of Prussia (1795 – 1861) to the Incorporated Church Building Society in 1857.
