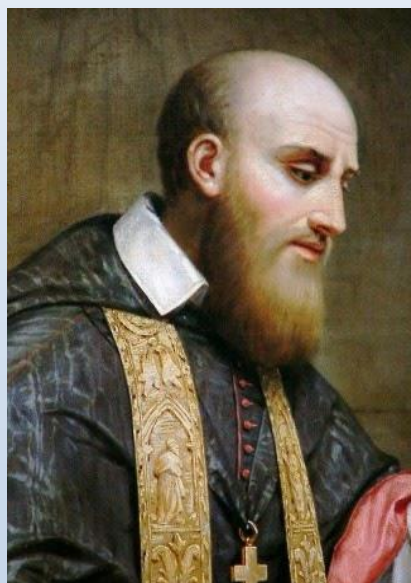

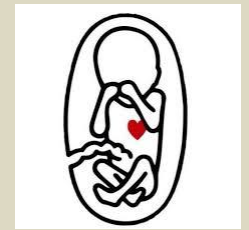
3rd Sunday After Epiphany

Have you noticed that the 'introits', sung at the beginning of the Mass, are all the same in these Sundays after the Epiphany, from this third Sunday? 'Adore God, all you His angels: Sion heard, and was glad: and the daughters of Juda rejoiced' (from Ps. 96). The theme of the 'adoration' of God was also present in the first two Sundays after the Epiphany: have a look in your missals. Although we have left the main celebration of Christmas, it continues, in a sense, up until the feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin and the Presentation of the Lord on 2 February. That is why we still have our crib in the church. The Church invites us to continue to adore Our Blessed Lord, the 'Word made flesh'. She wants to emphasise to us the divinity of Christ, because this is central to understanding the mission which Jesus, true God and true man, was given by His heavenly Father. The central mysteries of our redemption, which we will focus on with great intensity in the liturgy of Lent, Holy Week and Easter, need to be seen in the light of Christ's divinity, as we contemplate the humanity which God took upon Himself. Such was the way of divine providence in recalling man to his true destiny, namely union with God our creator, the God who is all love, and the opportunity - indeed opportunities - to be free from the bonds of sin and death, with the promise of eternal life. 'Let us adore the Lord for it is He who made us' (beginning of Matins for Sundays after the Epiphany).

Conference Speakers

- **Stephanie Gray** is an experienced debater and communicator. She has reached vast audiences through lectures and television work, using her wide experience of speaking with people affected by abortion around the world.
- **Dr Calum Miller** studied Medicine at Oxford University before working full-time as a doctor. He has also completed a Master's in Biblical Studies, and he is also a Visiting Research Scholar in Bioethics at the University of Oxford.
- **Obianuju Ekeocha** is a Nigerian woman living and working in the UK as a biomedical scientist. She is the founder of Culture of Life Africa, an organisation dedicated to defending the sanctity of and the dignity of human life, through research, information and education.
- **Michael Wee** is the Education and Research Officer of the Anscombe Bioethics Centre, an independent research institute based in Oxford.
- **Fiorella Nash** is a writer and bioethicist in the United Kingdom with over ten years' experience researching life issues from a feminist perspective. Her latest book is "The Abolition of Woman - How radical feminism is betraying women."



Opened in October 2017, Saint Francis de Sales School in Gabon welcomes today 200 pupils, and the original buildings are already too small to accommodate them.

The original design was to build 17 buildings, and only 3 were realised for the opening. Other buildings are planned for the future, including a chapel, administration buildings and sports facilities.

Next summer, a group of young French people from Lille, France, are planning to go and help Canon Fragelli to build one of those buildings, which will include a library and a computer room (320m²).

At Saint Francis de Sales School, the children are taught the usual subjects, including Catechism, English and Latin, and, to help them finding a job later, learn gardening, baking, sewing or joinery.

An access to literature is really important to complete the cultural teaching, and knowing how to use a computer, which is very necessary in today's employment market.

The school is also an opportunity for the children and their families to discover the Latin Mass, and some of them are now coming for Sunday Mass at the Mission, which is very encouraging for Canon Fragelli to continue this beautiful project.
