## Second Sunday after Pentecost

This Sunday we celebrate the external solemnity of Corpus Christi, commemorating the institution of the Blessed Sacrament and Holy Mass by Our Blessed Lord. Although we also remember this on Holy Thursday, our joy is somewhat muted because of the events of Holy Week. It is therefore 'right and fitting' that, after Easter, we should praise and thank God for the gift of his very self in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. It is such a beautiful summer's feast. Christ, the Son of God, who is often likened to the sun, shines from the altar, tabernacle and monstrance with a spiritual brilliance.

He provides himself as food for our souls. We go in procession with our Eucharistic King, adoring Him and we take Him outside to proclaim to the world His true presence, His Divinity and His kingship.

Our hearts should be full of joy this day, and we should not be afraid to ask Our Blessed Lord for those graces which we, and those around us, are in special need of. So much can be said about the Holy Eucharist and the Mass, but it seems appropriate to leave the last word to St. Thomas Aquinas,

who composed the liturgical texts which we use on this beautiful day : 'O Sacred banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of His passion renewed, the mind filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory given to us, alleluia'.

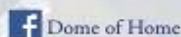

# Shrine Restoration Progress Report

Community Chats	These were started initially as a means of collecting archive photographs, but insufficient material was submitted. However they have evolved into a successful social forum.	The 6 meetings for pilot have been completed and we are awaiting the feedback but hope that these chats will continue.
Art day for schools	St Edwards year 9 art students spent a morning at the Shrine, with a talk on photography from John Aron and 'The History Of Church Art as a Means Of Teaching Faith' by Fr Gribbin.	Good feedback from the school. We are waiting feedback from other schools to see if this is feasible. All volunteers to adhere to volunteer and safeguarding policies,
Care home (for the elderly) visits to the Dome	Pilot visit has just taken place. This evolved from the 'Community Chats' We aim to welcome residents of local care homes to give them the opportunity to come to church and tailor the visit to their requirements.	Volunteer training in dementia awareness. Volunteers to follow Volunteer and Safeguarding policies, available from Anne.
Reflection book	Produce a free, high quality book with images by local artists and photographers. Whilst we hope this will appeal to all, we aim to engage those who are housebound. We are hoping to use some of the images submitted for the fundraising calendar.	Awaiting feedback
Hymn CD	Produce a free CD of well loved traditional hymns, sung by local choirs and singers which will be distributed with the reflection book.	Planned 2020. Flyer with feedback questions ready for distribution.
History observation	Visit planned in October for Liverpool University history students who are studying The Reformation, to observe a Tridentine Mass, followed by an explanation from Fr. Gribbin	History Dept Partnership secured with feedback from students in October.
Scaffolding tours	Our architect is hoping to organise a visit from EASA (Ecclesiastical Architect and Surveyors Association with possibility of a few places available for tours on the scaffolding for other people, depending on interest and contractor on site.	Awaiting Feedback

As part of the grant application we must raise some funds ourselves (Match funding) This is overseen by the 'Friends of the Shrine' group (which you are all welcome to join!). Organized so far: **Summer Fair 29<sup>th</sup> June, Sponsored Walk 11<sup>th</sup> August (in conjunction with St John's Hospice) and the 200+ Club.**

We also have been busy collecting art work for a **fundraising calendar** which we hope will be on sale by September 2019. Art work will also be displayed in the Williamson Art Gallery throughout November 2019 and we will have a **recital at the Williamson on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2019** – more details to follow.

As you can see there has been a huge amount of work going on, including writing draft policies which all volunteers will need to follow. These are available via Anne and awaiting final approval.
