LENT 2019

Dear friends of the Shrine,

Holy Mother Church takes her beloved children on a lengthy journey, sustained by fasting, prayer and abstinence, through the wilderness of Lent, and the solemn commemoration of our redemption during 'Holy Week'.

On the first day of that most sacred week, we go in procession and proclaim Our Blessed Lord as King, with hosannas and shouts of acclamation. And yet joy is turned to sorrow, as we read the Gospel of the Passion. During sung Mass is the 'planctus', the last section of the Gospel, a sweet and mournful chant. It is a 'cri de coeur', urging sorrow for Our Lord's death and repentance for our sins.

The Sacred 'triduum' is the 'consummatum est' of Lent. On Holy Thursday we celebrate the institution of the sacred priesthood in the Upper Room and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the re-presentation of Calvary, to the praise and glory of God and to bring spiritual food for our earthly journey. Our Lord is carried in procession, in a chalice, as if to be buried. And yet, it is the living Lord whom we accompany to the Altar of Repose, and there, fall to our knees in silent adoration and love.

And then, on Good Friday, comes Our Lord's captivity, unjust trial and condemnation, and His bitter passion and death. At the altar the priest receives Our Lord in Holy Communion, after elevating Him for the adoration of all. At that moment we can say with the centurion at Calvary: 'Truly this was the Son of God'.

Henceforth, to Holy Saturday, we are silent, mourning for our dead Lord. But such silence will not endure. At the great Easter Vigil a new light is kindled and the paschal candle is solemnly blessed with chant, and the resurrection of Our Lord is proclaimed.

A new day is made by the Lord, 'exsultemus et laetemur in ea'. 'In Cruce salus' – in the cross is salvation. Blessed Lenten season.

Restoration project update

Fundraising appeal for our church heating!



Dear friends,

During our previous restoration phases of our beloved church of Ss Peter & Paul and St Philomena, several people raised the matter of fixing our heating system. this is needed now! HLF grants have been used to improve the insulation of the church, stop the draughts with the glazed screen (*left*), and the water getting in. This has significantly reduced our gas bill.

It is now time to plan this new project. Acting on advice from our Architect, Mark Pearce, I have engaged a Heating engineer from Bob Costello Associates Ltd, to undertake a survey of our actual heating system, to indicate me problems, and solutions. I will soon share with you his professional recommendations and advice.

From Bob's first visit, it seems clear that we need more efficient boilers. The existing ones (*right*) still operate, but are not efficient and wasting money! As you can see on this photo (*below right*), one of them broke down during winter. Bob Costello also noticed that the air heating system is damaged: at least one of the pipes is totally disconnected! (*left*)



Right now, I have to pay for the survey itself. Estimated costs of a new system are still to be calculated, but I need to anticipate the expenses on this very important project. Could you please help fundraising or pledge your financial support towards the final bill? I will regularly update you about progress.
