I am the Lord your God

Summary of Canon Montjean's third talk on faith, which can be heard in full on you tube

"The fool hath said in his heart: There is no God." Ps XIII

The psalmist uses the word 'fool' which therefore implies that belief in God necessitates us to use our intelligence. Since God is the creator of all that exists, the virtue of faith in God illuminates our intelligence. Conversely sin, which obstructs supernatural grace, darkens our intelligence. The psalm goes on to say 'in his heart' and since only God can judge correctly what is in the depths of man's heart, we can never judge our neighbour who may say they do not believe in God. Looking at the harmony, beauty and grandeur of the natural world, people, especially children, find it easy to understand that it has a cause that has been created by divine intelligence. When we contemplate creation, we can be but humble before such grandeur and this humility prepares us to find God. Science is merely the unfolding of the intelligence of God. Thus wisdom seeks the cause of the beauty we see and is not content to just admire it without ever seeking to know its author.

One of the first questions in the penny catechism is 'Who made you?' Answer 'God made me'. While God creates our soul, our parents procreate our flesh. The love and care our parents have for us (their love will persist eternally) should induce us to respond with love and gratitude. The second penny catechism question is 'Why did God make you?' Answer 'To know Him and love Him, to serve Him in this world and to be happy with Him forever in the next.' Here the very nature of God's bounteous love is revealed. All has been created to bring us into eternal happiness with Him. The creed is not 'I believe in God the almighty', but I believe in God THE FATHER, the almighty.



PROPERs of the MASS

10th Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT *Palm 54. 17-23*

When I cried to the Lord He heard my voice, from them that draw near to me; and He humbled them, who is before all ages, and remains for ever: cast thy care upon the Lord, and He shall sustain thee. *Ps.* Hear, O God, my prayer, and despise not my supplication; be attentive to me and hear me. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

God, who dost manifest Thy almighty power chiefly in showing mercy and pity; increase Thy mercy towards us, that we, seeking the way of Thy promises, may be made partakers of Thy heavenly treasures. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE I *Corinthians 12. 2-11*

Brethren, you know that, when you were heathens, you went to dumb idols, according as you were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man, speaking by the Spirit of God, saith Anathema to Jesus; and no man can say: The Lord Jesus, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of graces, but the same Spirit; and there are diversities of ministries, but the same Lord; and there are diversities of operations, but the same God, who worketh all in all. And the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man unto profit. To one indeed, by the Spirit, is given the word of wisdom; and to another, the word of knowledge, according to the same Spirit; to another the grace of healing in one Spirit; to another, the working of miracles; to another, prophecy; to another, the discerning of spirits; to another, divers kinds of tongues; to another, interpretation of speeches. But all these things one and the same Spirit worketh, dividing to every one according as He will.

GRADUAL *Psalms 16. 8, 2*

Keep me, O Lord, as the apple of Thy eye: protect me under the shadow of Thy wings. *V.* Let my judgment come forth from Thy countenance: let Thy eyes behold the things that are equitable.

ALLELUIA *Psalms 64. 2*

Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* A hymn, O God, becometh Thee in Sion: and a vow shall be paid to Thee in Jerusalem. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Luke 18. 9-14*

At that time Jesus spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves as just, and despised others. Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a Publican. The Pharisee standing, prayed thus with himself: O God, I give Thee thanks that I am

not as the rest of men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers; as also is this publican. I fast twice in the week; I give tithes of all that I possess. And the Publican standing afar off would not so much as lift up his eyes towards heaven, but struck his breast saying: O God, be merciful to me a sinner. I say to you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

OFFERTORY *Psalms 24. 1-3*

To Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded.

SECRET

May these sacrifices, O Lord, which Thou hast appointed to be offered up to Thee for the glory of Thy name so be made holy, that they may become a remedy for all our ills. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what by Thy revelation we believe of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation; so that in confessing the true and eternal Godhead, in It we should adore distinction in persons, unity in Essence, and equality in Majesty: in praise of which Angels and Archangels, Cherubim also and Seraphim day and night exclaim, without end and with one voice saying:

COMMUNION *Psalms 50. 21*

Thou wilt accept the sacrifice of justice, oblations and holocausts, upon Thy altar, O Lord.

POSTCOMMUNION

Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord our God, that Thy gracious help may never be lacking to us whose strength Thou ceasest not to renew with Thy divine sacraments. Through our Lord.
