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Quo Vadis Domine?
Where are you going Lord?

*Excerpts from Mgr Wach's article published in full in
'the yearly review of the ICKSP 2020 - Romanity'*

Along the *Via Appia* (Rome), the route that links that majestic basilica to the catacombs, there can be seen a sanctuary of modest size and attraction that the uninformed visitor would risk overlooking. It is precisely on this site, named the *Quo Vadis*, that St. Peter, fleeing the persecutions of the imperial city, encountered Christ. "*Where are you going, Lord? -I'm going to Rome, to be crucified again there.*" [...]

We, in our turn, must not cease to ask Him where He is going, where He is leading us, towards which perils and tribulations, not out of fear and defiance, but in order to consent with greater generosity to the sacrifices that He wants us to make. Our Lord reminds us of the radical nature of His message, according to the pains and tribulations of our personal history.

He wishes that we accept with a supernatural resignation the small martyrdoms that appear on our way to destroy the corrupt man in us. [...]

Today, we could question as to whether Romanity is outdated with its traditions, teachings and rites, which it presents as the sublime heritage of two thousand years of uninterrupted tradition. [...] Far from ageing or disappearing to become a product of each passing age, the Roman spirit advances in intensity and pertinence; it clothes itself with new attire each day, and this gives it an unequalled innocence. No, her precious deposit is not a thing of the past and will never be so – because it is outside time. Meanwhile, the contemporary world ages quickly, at the same rate as its illusions, fashions and whims. [...]

Therefore it is the time for us to remind ourselves that the Roman Catholic Church is divine, that she is "*without spot or stain*", and that God will not allow her enemies to triumph over her. In the very same way as after the sacking of Rome (a punishment rightly merited for the disgrace and infidelity of the clergy), the Church will recover her liveliness, be more beautiful than ever, and enlighten the world. At the end of a prolonged winter it is the Roman spirit that will grant us a new springtime and the blessings from heaven which have been promised to us.

Let us ask St. Peter, Prince of the Apostles, to guide and reassure Holy Mother Church. By his example, may we be able to face the temptations and trials of our time. Let us not leave Christ to offer Himself in sacrifice a second time, but let us return to Rome, with zeal and confidence, to proclaim our faith, and to give joyful and radiant witness by our works, closely uniting our intentions to that of Holy Mother Church.

INTROIT *Palm. 46. 2*

Clap your hands, all ye nations: shout unto God with the voice of joy. *Ps.* For the Lord is most high, He is terrible; He is a great King over all the earth. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

God, Whose providence in the ordering of all things never fails; we humbly beseech Thee to put away from us all harmful things, and to give us those which are profitable for us. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE *Romans 6. 19-23*

Brethren: I speak a human thing, because of the infirmity of your flesh; for as you have yielded your members to serve uncleanness and iniquity unto iniquity, so now yield your members to serve justice unto sanctification. For when you were the servants of sin, you were free from just ice. What fruit therefore had you then in those things, of which you are now ashamed? For the end of them is death. But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, you have your fruit unto sanctification, and the end life everlasting. For the wages of sin is death. But the grace of God is life everlasting; in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GRADUAL *Psalms 33. 12, 6*

Come children, hearken to me: I will teach you the fear of the Lord. *V.* Come ye to Him and be enlightened; and your faces shall not be confounded.

ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* O clap your hands, all ye nations; shout unto God with the voice of joy. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Matthew 7. 15-21*

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Beware of false prophets, who come to you in the clothing of sheep, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. By their fruits you shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, and the evil tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not every one that saith to Me: Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of My

Father who is in heaven, he shall enter into the kingdom of heaven.

OFFERTORY *Daniel 3. 40*

As in holocausts of rams and bullocks, and as in thousands of fat lambs; so let our sacrifice be made in Thy sight this day, that it may please Thee: for there is no confusion to them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

SECRET

God Who, in this one sacrifice, hast perfected the offering of the many victims prescribed under the Old Law: receive this same sacrifice offered by Thy devoted servants and sanctify it with a blessing, like unto that which Thou didst bestow upon the offerings of Abel; so that what each has offered here to the glory of Thy name, may profit all unto salvation. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what by Thy revelation we believe of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation; so that in confessing the true and eternal Godhead, in It we should adore distinction in persons, unity in Essence, and equality in Majesty: in praise of which Angels and Archangels, Cherubim also and Seraphim day and night exclaim, without end and with one voice saying:

COMMUNION *Psalms 30. 3*

Bow down Thy ear, make haste to deliver me.

May Thy healing work in our souls mercifully free us from our perverse inclinations O Lord, and lead us ever to do that which is right in Thy sight. Through our Lord.
