## THE WEDDING FEAST AT CANA

*This was the beginning of Jesus' miracles... and He manifested His glory.*



**And Jesus' mother said to them, "Do whatever He tells you to do."**

The Gospel of today's Holy Mass tells us of our Blessed Lord's first public miracle, changing water into wine to provide for his friends at their wedding feast. This is the third and final mystery of the Epiphany of Our Blessed Lord, by which His divinity is manifested to us. Jesus' miracles not only prove to us that He is the Son of God, but they also teach us so much about God and about His love for us. In the miracle of the water turned to wine, we see not only that Jesus is concerned with our material needs, but how He wishes to transform our human nature by the power of His divine grace, all through the intercession of His Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. Let us heed our mother's words today!

## Canon Altieri: your prayers for his recovery

Last week, we learned that dear Canon Francis Xavier Altieri has been hospitalised in the United States as a result of Coronavirus. We understand from our American confrères that Canon is now stable but receiving supplemental oxygen. He is not using a ventilator.

Canon served at Ss. Peter & Paul and St. Philomena, New Brighton for 12 months as a deacon before being ordained by His Eminence, Raymond Leo Cardinal Burke at St Francis de Sales Oratory, Saint Louis, Missouri on the 5th August 2014. He was then assigned as the first Rector of St Walburge, Preston before being assigned to the United States.

We have now learned that Canon Joel Estrada, Canon Altieri's classmate and Pastor of St. Patrick's in Waterbury, Connecticut, has also been diagnosed with Coronavirus and was hospitalised Wednesday. He is responding well to therapy.

# PROPERS of the MASS

## Second Sunday after Epiphany

### INTROIT *Psalm 65. 4*

Let all the earth adore Thee O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Most High. Ps. Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise V. Glory be to the Father.

### COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God who dost govern all things in heaven and earth, mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace all the days of our life. Through our Lord.

### EPISTLE *Romans 12. 6–16*

Brethren: Having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us: either proph- ecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth, in doctrine; he that exhorteth, in exhorting; he that giveth, with simplicity; he that ruleth, with carefulness; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the char- ity of brotherhood, with honour prevent- ing one another: in carefulness not sloth- ful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: re- joicing in hope: patient in tribulation: in- stant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

### GRADUAL *Psalm 106. 20–21*

The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them from their destruction. V. Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonderful works to the children of men.

### ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Praise ye the Lord, all His Angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

### GOSPEL *John 2. 1–11*

At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him: They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six water-pots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or

three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them: Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine: and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

### OFFERTORY *Psalm 65. 1–2, 16*

Shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, all ye that fear God, and I will tell you what great things the Lord hath done for my soul. Alleluia.

### SECRET

Sanctify, O Lord, the gifts which we offer, and cleanse us from the stains of our sins. Through our Lord.

### PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son, and the Holy Ghost, are one God, one Lord: not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what we believe by Thy revelation of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation. So that in confessing the true and everlasting Godhead, distinction in persons, unity in essence, and equality in majesty may be adored. Which the Angels and Archangels, the Cherubim also and Seraphim do praise: who cease not daily to cry out with one voice saying:

### COMMUNION *John 2. 7, 8, 9, 10–11*

The Lord saith: Fill the waterpots with water, and carry to the chief steward. When the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, he saith to the bridegroom: Thou hast kept the good wine until now. This first miracle did Jesus in the presence of His disciples.

### POSTCOMMUNION

May the operation of Thy power be increased within us; we beseech Thee, O Lord, that being quickened by Thy divine sacraments, we may by Thy bounty, be prepared to receive that which they promise. Through our Lord.
