BAPTISMAL GRACE

"By God's grace I am what I am, and His grace has not been made void."



Our blessed Lord's miraculous healing of the man both deaf and mute in today's holy Gospel is a figure of baptismal grace. We were once brought before Jesus, deaf and dumb in the life of the Spirit. On behalf of Jesus Christ, the priest welcomed us lovingly at the baptismal font, saying these same words over us, "Ephpheta. Be thou opened!" From that moment, our souls were made to hear the truths of the faith and our tongues were loosed to praise the one true God in His Church. Alas, over time, the distractions of the world and the revolt of our passions begin to drown out the voice of God in our hearts. We are mute in prayer, and our ears are plugged. Jesus wishes to renew the grace of our Baptism today. This is the grace we must ask of our blessed Lord in the Mass: that we may not only hear His voice, but that we may follow it without resistance. The more faithfully we follow it, the more sensitive we will be to the slightest whisper of His holy will for us. Additionally, let us ask for the grace to have our tongues loosed to praise the name of Jesus always, to call upon His mercy, and to ask humbly His pardon for our sins, acknowledging our faults with sincerity and sorrow. It is in the sacrament of Penance that we are able to restore that baptismal grace to our souls, that it may not be made void, and receive the infinite mercy of Jesus Christ our Saviour (text adapted from the book Divine Intimacy).

PROPERS of the MASS Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT Psalm 67. 6-7, 36

God in His holy place; God who maketh men of one mind to dwell in a house: He shall give power and strength to His people. Ps. Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered: and let them that hate Him flee from before His face. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Almighty and eternal God, Who in the abundance of Thy loving kindness art wont to give beyond the deserts and desires of those who humbly pray; pour down upon us Thy mercy, forgiving us these things of which our conscience is afraid, and granting us those blessings which we dare not presume to ask. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE I Corinthians 15. 1–10

Brethren: I make known unto you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you have received, and wherein you stand, by which also you are saved, if you hold fast after what manner I preached unto you, unless you have believed in vain. For I delivered unto you first of all, which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures; and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures; and that He was seen by Cephas, and after that by the eleven. Then was He seen by more than five hundred brethren at once; of whom many remain until this present, and some are fallen asleep. After that He was seen by James then by all the apostles. And last of all He was seen also by me, as by one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God; but by the grace of God I am what I am; and His grace in me hath not been void.

GRADUAL Psalm 27.7,1

In God hath my heart confided, and I have been helped; and my flesh hath flourished again; and with my will I will give praise to Him. V. Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent; depart not from me.

ALLELUIA Psalm 80. 2~3

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Rejoice to God our helper; sing aloud to the God of Jacob; take a pleasant psalm with the harp. Alleluia.

GOSPEL Mark 7. 31-37

At that time, Jesus going out of the coasts of Tyre, came by Sidon to the sea of Galilee, through the midst of the coasts of Decapolis. And they bring to Him one deaf and dumb, and they besought Him that He would lay His hand upon him. And taking him from the multitude apart, He put His fingers into his ears, and spitting, He touched his tongue; and looking up to heaven, He groaned and said to him: Ephphetha, which is, Be thou opened: and immediately his ears were opened, and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spoke right. And He charged them that they should tell no man: but the more He charged them so much the more a great deal did they publish it; and so much the more did they wonder, saying: He hath done all things well; He hath made both the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak.

OFFERTORY Psalm 29. 2-3

I will extol Thee, O Lord, for Thou hast upheld me; and hast not made my enemies to rejoice over me: O Lord, I have cried to Thee, and Thou hast healed me.

SECRET

Look down in mercy upon our service, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the gifts we offer may be acceptable unto Thee, and a support in our weakness. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what by Thy revelation we believe of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation; so that in confessing the true and eternal Godhead, in It we should adore distinction in persons, unity in Essence, and equality in Majesty: in praise of which Angels and Archangels, Cherubim also and Seraphim day and night exclaim, without end and with one voice saying:

Honour the Lord with thy substance, and with the first of all thy fruits: and thy barns shall be filled with abundance, and thy presses shall run over with wine.
