

THANKS BE TO GOD

"Arise and go thy way; thy faith has made thee whole."



The Gospel for today's Holy Mass shows us the remedies for sin. The first of these is sincere humility, recognizing one's own misery. However, humility itself is not enough; it must be coupled with confident recourse to God's merciful love. The poor lepers, overwhelmed by their misery put their trust in Jesus, making their plea to Him full of faith in His goodness. Let us notice that our divine Master does not heal them though right away; He sends them to the priests. Obeying humbly, they were healed. This a perfect figure of the sacrament of Penance! Do we have faith in the sacred words of absolution? Do we doubt the forgiveness of our sins in confession? Are we thankful for this sacrament of forgiveness? Only one of the ten lepers, once all doomed to death, returned to thank our Blessed Lord for healing him. "Blessed is the soul," St. Bernard says, "who every time he receives a gift of grace from God, returns to Him who responds to our gratitude by giving us even more graces. The greatest hindrance to progress in the spiritual life is ingratitude, for God counts as lost the graces we receive with ingratitude, withholding those we could receive if only we were thankful." Let us not only remember to return to Jesus truly present in tabernacle to thank Him after receiving holy absolution in the sacrament of Penance, but let us always spend time after Holy Mass in quite prayer and thanksgiving for the graces we have received in receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist. PROPERS of the MASS

Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT Psalm 73. 20, 19, 23

Have regard, O Lord, to Thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor: arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause, and forget not the voices of them that seek Thee. Ps. O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end: why is Thy wrath enkindled against the sheep of Thy pasture V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God, grant unto us an increase of faith, hope and charity: and that we may obtain what Thou dost promise, make us love that which Thou dost command. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE Galatians 3. 16-22

Brethren: To Abraham were the promises made, and to his seed. He saith not: And to his seeds, as of many; but as of one, and to thy seed, which is Christ. Now this I say, that the testament which was confirmed by God, the law which was made after four hundred and thirty years, doth not disannul, to make the promise of no effect. For if the inheritance be of the law, it is no more of promise. But God gave it to Abraham by promise. Why then was the law? It was set because of transgressions, until the seed should come, to whom He made the promise; being ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator. Now a mediator is not of one: but God is one. Was the law then against the promises of God? God forbid. For if there had been a law given, which could give life, verily justice should have been by the law. But the Scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by the faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe.

GRADUAL Psalm 73. 20, 19, 22

Have regard, O Lord, to Thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor. V. Arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause: remember the reproach of Thy servants.

ALLELUIA Psalm 89. 1

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Lord, thou hast been our refuge, from generation to generation. Alleluia.

GOSPEL Mark 7. 31-37

At that time, as Jesus was going to Jerusalem, he passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee: and as He entered into a certain town, there met him ten men that were lepers, who stood afar off, and lifted up their voice, saying: Jesus, master, have mercy on us. Whom when He saw, He said: Go, show yourselves to the priests. And it came to pass, as they went, they were made clean. And one of them, when he saw that he was made clean, went back, with a loud voice glorifying God: and he fell on his face before His feet, giving thanks: and this was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering said: Were not ten made clean? And where are the nine? There is no one found to return, and give glory to God, but this stranger. And He said to him: Arise, go thy way; for thy faith hath made thee whole.

OFFERTORY Psalm 30. 15-16

In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped; I said: Thou art my God, my times are in Thy hands.

SECRET

Look with favour, O Lord, upon Thy people; look with favour upon their offerings: and appeased by this oblation, mercifully forgive us our sins and grant what we ask. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what by Thy revelation we believe of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation; so that in confessing the true and eternal Godhead, in It we should adore distinction in persons, unity in Essence, and equality in Majesty: in praise of which Angels and Archangels, Cherubim also and Seraphim day and night exclaim, without end and with one voice saying:

Thou hast given us, O Lord, bread from heaven, having in it all that is delicious, and the sweetness of every taste.
