DO YE GOOD TO ALL

"Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfil the law of Christ."



The dominant theme found in today's Holy Mass is one that is quite simple but most profound, namely, that God is *good*. Whatever good there is in us is the fruit of His grace, by which we remain steadfast in good (from today's Collect) and do good to others (today's Epistle). Only by God's grace do we rise from the death of sin (symbolized in the miracle of today's Gospel), and in His infinite goodness does He offer us the Sacred Body of His Divine Son in the Eucharist so that our souls may be truly united to Him as the source of all grace. Without Jesus, we would remain in the spiritual death of sin; through Him, with Him and in Him are we able to be pleasing to God the Father and live the glorious life of the Spirit described by St. Paul in the Epistle today. "While we still have time," he exhorts us, "let us do good to all, but especially to those who are in the household of faith." By bearing each other's burdens with compassion, encouraging one another in the ways of faith, we imitate the goodness of God, and manifest His love to others. Such kindness seeks no reward other than God's glory; for if everything we have is only by God's grace, then everything we do ought to be for His glory. Let us make the prayer of Holy Mother Church our prayer today: In soul and in body, O Lord, may we be ruled by the operation of the heavenly gift of your goodness; that the graces flowing therefrom (not the impulses of our nature) may inspire all our actions. Through Christ our Lord, amen.

PROPERs of the MASS

Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT *Psalm 85. 1, 2–3*

Incline Thine ear, O Lord, to me and hear me: save Thy servant, O my God, that trusteth in Thee: have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all day. Ps. Give joy to the soul of Thy servant; for to Thee, O Lord, I have lifted up my soul. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Let Thy continual pity cleanse and defend Thy Church, we beseech Thee, O Lord; and because it cannot continue in safety without Thee, govern it evermore by Thy help. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE *Galatians 5. 25–26; 6. 1–10*

Brethren: If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfil the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let everyone prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For every one shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived: God is not mocked; for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh also shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the faith.

GRADUAL *Psalm 91. 2–3*

It is good to give praise to the Lord; and to sing to Thy name, O Most High. V. To show forth Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth in the night.

ALLELUIA *Psalm 94. 3*

Alleluia, alleluia. V. For the Lord is a great God, and a great King over all the earth. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Luke 7. 11–16*

At that time, Jesus went into a city called Naim; and there

went with Him His disciples, and a great multitude. And when He came nigh to the city, behold a dead man was carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow, and a great multitude of the city were with her. And when the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her, and said to her: Weep not. And He came near and touched the bier. And they that carried it stood still. And He said: Young man, I say to thee, Arise: and he that was dead sat up, and began to speak. And He delivered him to his mother. And there came a fear on them all: and they glorified God, saying: A great prophet is risen up amongst us, and God hath visited His people.

OFFERTORY *Psalm 39. 2, 3, 4*

With expectation I have waited for the Lord, and He had regard to me; and he heard my prayer, and He put a new canticle into my mouth, a song to our God.

SECRET

May Thy Sacraments, O Lord, be our safeguard, and ever defend us against the attacks of the evil one. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what by Thy revelation we believe of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation; so that in confessing the true and eternal Godhead, in It we should adore distinction in persons, unity in Essence, and equality in Majesty: in praise of which Angels and Archangels, Cherubim also and Seraphim day and night exclaim, without end and with one voice saying:

COMMUNION *John 6. 52*

The bread that I will give is My flesh for the life of the world.
