

GO UP HIGHER

"That Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts."



Today's Holy Mass presents to us a succinct summary of the spiritual life. Every Christian soul must be "rooted and founded in charity" in order to behold the infinite goodness of God for all eternity. This exalted state of everlasting beatitude is only possible by the gift of God's grace, and it will only be ours if we humble ourselves each day to receive from God whatever it pleases Him to send us. In the words of our Divine Saviour in the Gospel, "he who humbles himself will be exalted." In other words, if we desire to "go up higher" by God's grace, we must first willingly "take the lowest place." Such a voluntary abasement of self renders us not only more willing to serve others in their needs, but also detaches us from the honours and esteem of this world and its opinions. In today's holy Gospel, our Blessed Lord heals a man sick with dropsy. This illness is indicated by the swelling of the body, often because the heart is not working as it should. A lethargic soul, always concerned about himself (his comfort, security, self image, etc.) will also "take on water", swelling with self-love, pride, and vanity. Humbling himself, the sick man, ashamed at the disfigurement of his soul swollen with pride, seeks the healing gaze of our Lord Jesus Christ, who then sends him on his way to live the truth in charity. No longer stagnant and idle, his heart is able to regain its strength to love God above all things and love his neighbour as himself. May our hearts swell with the love of God, so as to "go up higher."

PROPERS of the MASS Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT Psalm 85. 3, 5

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all the day; for Thou, O Lord, art sweet and mild and plenteous in mercy to all that call upon Thee. Ps. Incline Thy ear to me, O Lord, and hear me; for I am needy and poor. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O Lord, we pray Thee that Thy grace may always precede and follow us, and make us continually intent upon all good works. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE Ephesians 3. 13-21

Brethren: I pray you not to faint at my tribulations for you, which are your glory. For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom all paternity in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened by His Spirit with might unto the inward man. That Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts; that being rooted and founded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the saints, what is the breadth and length, and height, and depth. To know also the charity of Christ, which surpasseth all knowledge; that you may be filled unto all the fullness of God. Now to Him who is able to do all things more abundantly than we desire or understand, according to the power that worketh in us: to Him be glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus, unto all generations, world without end. Amen.

GRADUAL Psalm 101. 16-17

The Gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord, and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. V. For the Lord hath built up Sion, and He shall be seen in His majesty.

ALLELUIA Psalm 97. 1

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Sing ye to the Lord a new canticle, because the Lord hath done wonderful things. Alleluia.

GOSPEL Luke 14. 1–11

At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chief of the Pharisees on the Sabbath day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold, there was a certain man before Him that had dropsy: and Jesus answering, spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying: Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath day? But they held their peace: but He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit, and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath day? And they could not answer Him these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them: When thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honourable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee and him, come and say to thee: Give this man place; and then, thou begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh, he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

OFFERTORY Psalm 39. 14–15

Look down, O Lord, to help me; let them be confounded and ashamed that seek after my soul to take it away; look down, O Lord, to help me.

SECRET

Cleanse our hearts, we beseech Thee, O Lord, through the effects of this sacrifice: and in Thy mercy make us worthy to partake thereof. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what by Thy revelation we believe of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation; so that in confessing the true and eternal Godhead, in It we should adore distinction in persons, unity in Essence, and equality in Majesty: in praise of which Angels and Archangels, Cherubim also and Seraphim day and night exclaim, without end and with one voice saying:

COMMUNION Psalm 70. 16-17, 18

O Lord, I will be mindful of Thy justice alone: Thou hast taught me, O God, from my youth, and unto old age and grey hairs, O God, forsake me not.

POSTCOMMUNION

In Thy loving kindness, O Lord, purify our souls, we beseech Thee, and renew them by this heavenly sacrament, that in both the present and future, even our bodies therein may find relief. Through our Lord.
