EYES OF FAITH

"Charity believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."



In today's Epistle, St. Paul tells us of the paramount importance of the supernatural virtue of *charity*. If we are void of charity, all else is in vain. The most sure way for us to increase in the virtue of charity ourselves is by spending time in the presence of He who is Divine Charity made flesh, that is our Lord Jesus Christ, truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist. When we seek His Eucharistic Face in the Most Blessed Sacrament with faith (like that of the blind man mentioned in today's holy Gospel), Jesus heals us of our own blindness to see our lack of charity towards Him and others. With mercy and benevolence, He increases in us that very virtue, making us more like Him and pleasing to the Father. This Lent, let us make firm resolutions to increase in charity, beginning by adoring our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist.

PROPERS of the MASS

Quinquagesima Sunday

INTROIT Psalm 30. 3-4

Be Thou unto me a God, a protector, and a place of refuge, to save me: for Thou art my strength and my refuge: and for Thy name's sake Thou wilt lead me, and nourish me. Ps. In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and save me. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

We beseech Thee, O Lord, mercifully hear our prayers, that being loosed from the bonds of our sins, we may be defended by Thee against all adversity. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE I Corinthians 13. 1–13

Brethren, if I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal. And if I should have prophecy, and should know all mysteries and all knowledge; and if I should have all faith so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. And if I should distribute all my goods to feed the poor, and if I should deliver my body to be burned and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing. Charity is patient, is kind; Charity envieth not, dealeth not perversely, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, seeketh not her own, is not provoked to anger, thinketh no evil, rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth with the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Charity never falleth away; whether prophecies shall be made void, or tongues shall cease, or knowledge shall be destroyed. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, that which is in part shall be done away. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child. But when I became a man, I put away the things of a child. We see now through a glass in a dark manner; but then face to face. Now I know in part; but then I shall know even as I am known. And now there remain faith, hope and charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.

GRADUAL Psalm 76. 15-16

Thou art the God that alone dost wonders: Thou hast made Thy power known among the nations. V. With Thy arm Thou hast delivered Thy people, the children of Israel and of Joseph.

TRACT Psalm 99. 1-2

SING joyfully to God, all the earth: serve ye the Lord with gladness. V. Come in before His presence with exceeding great joy: know ye that the Lord He is God. V. He made us, and not we ourselves: but we are His people and the sheep of His pasture.

GOSPEL Luke 18. 31-43

At that time Jesus took unto Him the twelve and said to them: Behold, we go up to Jerusalem, and all things shall be accomplished which were written by the Prophets concerning the Son of Man. For He shall be delivered to the Gentiles, and shall be mocked and scourged and spit upon: and after they have scourged Him, they will put Him to death, and the third day He shall rise again. And they understood none of these things, and this word was hid from them, and they understood not the things that were said. Now it came to pass, when He drew nigh to Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the wayside, begging. And when he heard the multitude passing by, he asked what this meant. And they told him that Iesus of Nazareth was passing by. And he cried out, saying: Jesus, son of David, have mercy on me. And they that went before rebuked him, that he should hold his peace. But he cried out much more: Son of David, have mercy on me. And Jesus standing, commanded him to be brought unto him. And when he was come near, He asked him, saying: What wilt thou that I do to thee? But he said: Lord, that I may see. And Jesus said to him: Receive thy sight, thy faith hath made thee whole. And immediately he saw and followed Him glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

OFFERTORY Psalm 118. 12-13

Blessed art Thou, O Lord, teach me Thy justifications: with my lips I have pronounced all the judgments of Thy mouth.

SECRET

May these sacrifices, we beseech Thee, O Lord, cleanse our offenses, and sanctify the bodies and minds of Thy servants for the celebration of this sacrifice. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son, and the Holy Ghost, are one God, one Lord: not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what we believe by Thy revelation of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation. So that in confessing the true and everlasting Godhead, distinction in persons, unity in essence, and equality in majesty may be adored. Which the Angels and Archangels, the Cherubim also and Seraphim do praise: who cease not daily to cry out with one voice saying:
