"I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have nothing to eat."



In the collect prayer for the 6th Sunday after Pentecost (commemorated today), Holy Mother Church implores God almighty on behalf of her beloved children that He would, "grant us an increase of true religion," so what God has begun in us by His grace may be brought to completion for His glory and our salvation. The virtue of religion is rightly considered a justice towards God, rendering to Him what is due to Him for He alone is supremely good and deserving of all our love. True religion, therefore, is that by which we are able to effectively offer to God the praise and adoration that is due to Him. We must always remember, however, that our offering to the Father what is due to Him is only possible for us because of His eternally begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who "is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father (Romans 6. 4)." Through Him, with Him, and in Him, are we able to unite our desire to render to God what is due to Him and have it be truly efficacious unto our salvation. This is made possible by our Baptism, whereby we are incorporated into Christ's Body, the Church. In the Gospel today, we are told of a miracle, which prefigures what Jesus will do and does now for His Church, nourishing our souls with the Bread of Angels, the Most Holy Eucharist. By consuming the Body of Jesus, we not only become what we eat, but we are now able to render to the Father what is due to Him by the virtue of holy religion. *Deo gratias!*

PROPERs of the MASS

Feast of Ss. John Fisher and Thomas More

INTROIT *Psalm 33. 20, 21; 2*

Many were the afflictions of the just, and out of all these the Lord delivered them: the Lord keepeth all their bones, not one of them shall be broken. Ps. I will bless the Lord at all times: His praise shall be ever in my mouth. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O God, who didst raise up Thy blessed martyrs, John and Thomas, from among the English to be the defenders of the true faith and of the primacy of the holy Roman Church, grant that through their merits and prayers, we may all become and remain one by the profession of the same faith. Who lives with Thou.

EPISTLE *II Maccabees 6. 18–28*

In those days: Eleazar one of the chief of the scribes, a man advanced in years, and of a comely countenance, was pressed to open his mouth to eat swine's flesh. But he, choosing rather a most glorious death than a hateful life, went forward voluntarily to the torment. And considering in what manner he was come to it, patiently bearing, he determined not to do any unlawful things for the love of life. But they that stood by, being moved with wicked pity, for the old friendship they had with the man, taking him aside, desired that flesh might be brought, which it was lawful for him to eat, that he might make as if he had eaten, as the king had commanded of the flesh of the sacrifice: That by so doing he might be delivered from death: and for the sake of their old friendship with the man they did him this courtesy. But he began to consider the dignity of his age, and his ancient years, and the inbred honour of his grey head, and his good life and conversation from a child: and he answered without delay, according to the ordinances of the holy law, made by God, saying, that he would rather be sent into the other world. For it doth not become our age, said he, to dissemble: whereby many young persons might think that Eleazar, at the age of fourscore and ten years, was gone over to the life of the heathens: and so they, through my dissimulation, and for a little time of a corruptible life, should be deceived, and hereby I should bring a stain and a curse upon mine old age. For though, for the present time, I should be delivered from the punishments of men, yet should I not escape the hand of the Almighty neither alive nor dead. Wherefore by departing manfully out of this life, I shall shew myself worthy of mine old age: and I shall leave an example of fortitude to young men, if with a ready mind and constancy I suffer an honourable death, for the most venerable and most holy laws. And having spoken thus, he was forthwith carried to execution.

GRADUAL *Psalm 33. 6, 16*

Come ye to Him and be enlightened: and your faces shall not be confounded. The eyes of the Lord are upon the just: and His ears unto their prayers.

ALLELUIA *John 17. 3*

Alleluia, alleluia. This is eternal life: That they may know Thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast sent. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *John 10. 23–30*

At that time, Jesus was walking in the temple, in Solomon's portico. The Jews therefore gathered round Him, and said to Him, How long do You keep us in suspense? If You are the Christ, tell us openly. Jesus answered them, I tell you and you do not believe. The works that I do in the name of My Father, these bear witness concerning Me. But you do not believe because you are not of My sheep. My sheep hear My voice, and I know them and they follow Me. And I give them everlasting life; and they shall never perish, neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand. What My Father has given Me is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch anything out of the hand of My Father. I and the Father are one.

I know thy works, and thy faith and charity, and thy ministry and patience: and thy last works which are more than the former.
