Solemnity of St. Philomena

BAPTISMAL GRACE

"By God's grace I am what I am, and His grace has not been made void."



Our blessed Lord's miraculous healing of the man both deaf and mute in this Sunday's Gospel is a figure of baptismal grace. We were once brought before Jesus, deaf and dumb in the life of the Spirit. On behalf of Jesus Christ, the priest welcomed us lovingly at the baptismal font, saying these same words over us, "Ephpheta. Be thou opened!" From that moment, our souls were made to hear the truths of the faith and our tongues were loosed to praise the one true God in His Church. Alas, over time, the distractions of the world and the revolt of our passions begin to drown out the voice of God in our hearts. We are mute in prayer, and our ears are plugged. Jesus wishes to renew the grace of our Baptism today. This is the grace we must ask of our blessed Lord in the Mass: that we may not only hear His voice, but that we may follow it without resistance. The more faithfully we follow it, the more sensitive we will be to the slightest whisper of His holy will for us. Additionally, let us ask for the grace to have our tongues loosed to praise the name of Jesus always, to call upon His mercy, and to ask humbly His pardon for our sins, acknowledging our faults with sincerity and sorrow. It is in the sacrament of Penance that we are able to restore that baptismal grace to our souls, that it may not be made void, and receive the infinite mercy of Jesus Christ our Saviour (text adapted from the book Divine Intimacy).

PROPERS of the MASS External Solemnity of St. Philomena

INTROIT Psalm 118. 46-47, 1

I spoke of Thy testimonies before kings, and I was not ashamed: I meditated also on Thy commandments, which I loved. Ps. Blessed are the undefiled in the way: who walk in the law of the Lord. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O God, Who among the wonders of Thy power hast granted even to the weaker sex the triumph of martyrdom: mercifully grant that we who celebrate the heavenly birthday of blessed Philomena Thy virgin and martyr may, through her example, advance nearer to Thee. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE Wisdom 51. 1-8, 12

I will give glory to Thee, O Lord, O King, and I will praise Thee, O God my Saviour. I will give glory to Thy name: for Thou hast been a helper and protector to me, and hast preserved my body from destruction, from the snare of an unjust tongue, and from the lips of them that forge lies: and in the sight of them that stood by Thou hast been my helper. And Thou has delivered me, according to the multitude of the mercy of Thy name, from them that did roar prepared to devour; out of the hands of them that sought my life, and from the gates of afflictions which compassed me about: from the oppression of the flame which surrounded me, and in the midst of the fire I was not burnt: from the depth of the belly of hell, and from an unclean tongue, and from lying words, from an unjust king, and from a slanderous tongue. My soul shall praise the Lord even to death: because Thou, O Lord our God, deliverest them that wait for Thee, and savest the out of the hands of the nations.

GRADUAL Psalm 44. 3, 5

Thou hast loved justice, and hated iniquity. V. Therefore God, thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness.

ALLELUIA Psalm 44. 15, 16

Alleluia, alleluia. After her shall virgins be brought to the king: her neighbours shall be brought to thee with gladness. Alleluia.

GOSPEL Matthew 25. 1-13

At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of Heaven shall be like to ten virgins, who taking their lamps went out to meet the bridegroom and the bride. And five of them were foolish, and five wise; but the five foolish having taken their lamps, did not take oil with them: but the wise took oil in their vessels with the lamps. And the bridegroom tarrying, they all slumbered and slept. And at midnight there was a cry made: Behold the bridegroom cometh, go ye forth to meet him. Then all those virgins arose and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said to the wise: Give us of your oil, for our lamps are gone out. The wise answered, saying: Lest perhaps there be not enough for us and for you, go ye rather to them that sell, and buy for yourselves.

Now, whilst they went to buy, the bridegroom. came: and they that were ready went in with him to the marriage, and the door was shut. But at last came also the other virgins, saying: Lord, Lord, open to us. But he answering said: Amen I say to you, I know you not. Watch ye therefore, because you know not the day nor the hour.

OFFERTORY Psalm 44. 15, 16

After her shall virgins be brought to the King: her neighbours shall be brought to Thee with gladness and rejoicing: they shall be brought into the temple of the King, the Lord.

SECRET

Receive, O Lord, the gifts which we bring on the solemnity of blessed Philomena Thy virgin and martyr, through whose intercession we hope for deliverance. Through Our Lord.

COMMON PREFACE

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation that we should at all times and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: through Christ our Lord. through Whom the Angels praise Thy Majesty, Dominations worship, Powers stand in awe. The Heavens and the Heavenly hosts together with the blessed Seraphim in triumphant chorus unite to celebrate it. Together with them we entreat Thee, that Thou mayest bid our voices also to be admitted, while we say in lowly praise:

COMMUNION Psalm 118. 78, 80

Let the proud be ashamed, because they have done unjustly towards me: but I will be employed in Thy commandments and in Thy justifications, that I may not be confounded.

POSTCOMMUNION

May the mysteries which we have received be a help unto us, O Lord, and through the intercession of blessed Philomena Thy virgin and martyr, may they cause us to rejoice in Thine everlasting protection. Through our Lord.

PROPER LAST GOSPEL Mark 7. 31–37

At that time, Jesus going out of the coasts of Tyre, came by Sidon to the sea of Galilee, through the midst of the coasts of Decapolis. And they bring to Him one deaf and dumb, and they besought Him that He would lay His hand upon him. And taking him from the multitude apart, He put His fingers into his ears, and spitting, He touched his tongue; and looking up to heaven, He groaned and said to him: Ephphetha, which is, Be thou opened: and immediately his ears were opened, and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spoke right. And He charged them that they should tell no man: but the more He charged them so much the more a great deal did they publish it; and so much the more did they wonder, saying: He hath done all things well; He hath made both the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak.
