From DIVINE INTIMACY Meditations

The Characteristics of a Christian

Today's Epistle from St Paul, (*Eph.*, 3, 13-21) summarises spiritual life:

➤ The inward man is the human spirit regenerated by grace that has renounced material things. The struggle against our lower nature continues while we're on earth. St Paul asks for fortitude of the Holy Spirit because our own virtue is not sufficient unsupported.

- Christ with the Father and the Holy Spirit already dwells in a soul in a state of grace but the more profound His presence, the more deeply will a soul be penetrated with divine charity until truly rooted in love.
- If we could see as the blessed do, that God is love and wishes nothing but love; that the way to go to Him is the way of love; that suffering, mortification and humility are only means to reach perfect love, and to correspond with the love of God who is Charity! Then we would be "filled unto all the fullness of God."

In the Gospel, (*Lk.*, *14*, *1-11*) Jesus exhorts us to be rooted in love and humility, curing a man of dropsy on the Sabbath. Fraternal charity, looking after the needs of others is not opposed to the law sanctifying the Sabbath. Only he who is humble can really love God and his neighbour. Humility does not only refer to seeking lowly material places but also when our pride seeks to occupy the esteem and regard of others.

"There is no harm in humbling ourselves and believing we are less than we really are. But there is exceeding harm and great evil in wishing to elevate ourselves [...] preferring ourselves to even one. There is no danger in stooping too much through a low doorway, but a great danger in lifting our head above the lintel." (St Bernard)

Let us like saints, ask God to send a humiliation every time our pride tries to raise us above others, to become rooted in both humility and charity.

PROPERS of the MASS Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all the day; for Thou, O Lord, art sweet and mild and plenteous in mercy to all that call upon Thee. *Ps.* Incline Thy ear to me, O Lord, and hear me; for I am needy and poor. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O Lord, we pray Thee that Thy grace may always precede and follow us and make us continually intent upon all good works. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE

Ephesians 3. 13-21

Brethren: I pray you not to faint at my tribulations for you, which are your glory. For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom all paternity in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened by His Spirit with might unto the inward man. That Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts; that being rooted and founded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the saints, what is the breadth and length, and height, and depth. To know also the charity of Christ, which surpasseth all knowledge; that you may be filled unto all the fullness of God. Now to Him who is able to do all things more abundantly than we desire or understand, according to the power that worketh in us: to Him be glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus, unto all generations, world without end. Amen.

GOSPEL

Luke 14. 1-11

At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chief of the Pharisees on the Sabbath day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold, there was a certain man before Him that had dropsy: and Jesus answering, spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying: Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath day? But they held their peace: but He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit, and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath day? And they could not answer Him these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them: When thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honourable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee and him, come and say to thee: Give this man place; and then, thou begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh, he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: because everyone that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

Cleanse our hearts, we beseech Thee, O Lord, through the effects of this sacrifice: and in Thy mercy make us worthy to partake thereof. Through our Lord.

O Lord, I will be mindful of Thy justice alone: Thou hast taught me, O God, from my youth, and unto old age and grey hairs, O God, forsake me not.

POSTCOMMUNION

In Thy loving kindness, O Lord, purify our souls, we beseech Thee, and renew them by this heavenly sacrament, that in both the present and future, even our bodies therein may find relief. Through our Lord.
