

The road to our Eternal Home

From Divine Intimacy, p. 959-961

The liturgy of the last Sundays after Pentecost, warns us of the approaching end of all thing. It invites us to consider the uncertainty of the present life and turn our eyes towards eternal life awaiting us. Spontaneously, we reflect on the condition of our own soul to see how we have used the time God has given us (see Introit for confession, Collect for forgiveness and Epistle to use the time wisely). The only road that takes us to our eternal home is to do the will of God. Anyone who seeks and follows God's will with childlike docility will be guided by God's Spirit, the Holy Spirit.

"Lord, You know what is best...Do with me as You know best, as will most please You, and will be for Your greater honor....Lo, I am your servant, ready to obey You in all things; for I do not desire to live for myself, but for You: Oh, that I could do so I a faithful and perfect manner!

St Francis de Sales: True devotion

St Francis de Sales is the principal patron of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest. In his 'Introduction to the Devout Life', he gives instruction on how we can advance in our spiritual life. Chapter 1: True and living devotion presupposes the love of God. The love that is pleasing to his Divine majesty is called Grace; in so far as it gives us the strength to do good, it is called charity; but when it reaches such a degree of perfection that makes us not only do good but do so carefully, frequently and readily then it is called devotion.

Devotion is no other thing than a spiritual nimbleness and vivacity by means of which charity works in us and charity makes us observe all the commandments of God readily and diligently. (page 38). He warns against being deceived by exterior pious acts that are performed without charity.

INTROIT

All that Thou hast done to us, O Lord, Thou hast done in true judgment: because we have sinned against Thee, and we have not obeyed Thy commandments: but give glory to Thy Name, and deal with us according to the multitude of Thy mercy. Ps. Blessed are the undefiled in the way who walk in the law of the Lord. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

In Thy mercy, we beseech Thee, O Lord, grant to Thy faithful people pardon and peace, that they may be cleansed from all their sins and also serve Thee with a quiet mind. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE

Eph. 5: 15-21

Brethren: See how you walk circumspectly, not as unwise, but as wise redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore, become not unwise, but understanding what is the will of God. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is luxury but be ye filled with the Holy Spirit, speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns, and spiritual canticles, singing and making melody in your hearts to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things, in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to God and the Father being subject one to another in the fear of Christ.

GRADUAL

The eyes of all hope in Thee, O Lord and Thou givest them meat in due season. Thou openest Thy hand, and fillest every living creature with Thy blessing.

ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. My heart is ready, O God my heart is ready: I will sing, and will give praise to Thee, my glory. Alleluia.

GOSPEL

John 4: 46-53

At that time, there was a certain ruler whose son was sick at Capharnaum. He having heard that Jesus was come from Judæa into Galilee, went to Him, and prayed Him to come down, and heal his son for he was at the point of death. Jesus therefore said to him: Unless you see signs and wonders, you believe not. The ruler saith to Him: Lord, come down before my son die. Jesus saith to him: Go on thy way, thy son liveth. The man believed the word which Iesus had said to him, and went his way. And as he was going down, his servants met him, and they brought word, saying that his son lived. He asked therefore of them the hour wherein he grew better. And they said to him: Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him. The father therefore knew that it was at the same hour that Jesus said to him: Thy son liveth and himself believed, and his whole house.
