

"The need for a guide: to enter the path of devotion and make progress."

Chapter 1 recap: Devotion is explained as our love for God that makes us do good, carefully, frequently and readily.

Chapter 2 recap: Prayer, reception of the sacraments, charity and serving our neighbour is the means to Union with God.

Chapter 3 recap: That devotion is suited to all vocations and professions."

Chapter 4: Pray to God to give you a guide. The guide must be full of charity, of knowledge and of prudence; if one of these three qualities be wanting in him, there is a danger. When you have obtained such a guide, bless His Divine Majesty, remain constant and do not seek for any others but go on your way simply humbly and trustfully. Treat him with an open heart in all sincerity and fidelity and by this means your good will be examined and rendered more secure and your evil will be corrected and remedied. Although you may search, says the devout Saint Theresa of Avila, "you will never find out the will of God so assuredly as by way of this humble obedience so much recommended and practiced by all the devout men of old.'

Your Canons are happy to act as a 'Guide' or Spiritual Director if asked/needed, either as a 'one off' or regularly.

PROPERS of the MASS 23rd Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT

The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. Ps. Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Absolve, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the sins of Thy people; that we may be delivered by Thy goodness from the bonds of sins, which by our frailty we have committed. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE

Philippians 3. 17-21; 4. 1-3

Brethren, be followers of me, and observe them who walk so as you have our model. For many walk, of whom I have told you often (and now tell you weeping) that they are enemies of the cross of Christ; whose end is destruction, whose God is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame; who mind earthly things. But our conversation is in heaven, from whence also we look for the Saviour, our Lord Jesus Christ, who will reform the body of our lowness, made like to the body of His glory, according to the operation whereby also He is able to subdue all things unto Himself. Therefore, my brethren, dearly beloved, and most desired, my joy and my crown: so stand fast in the Lord, my dearly beloved: I beg of Evodia, and I beseech Syntyche to be of one mind in the Lord: and I entreat thee also, my sincere companion; help those women who have laboured with me in the Gospel, with Clement and the rest of my fellow-labourers, whose names are in the book of life.

GRADUAL

Thou hast delivered us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. V. In God we will glory all the day: and in Thy name we will give praise for ever.

ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. V. From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my prayer. Alleluia.

GOSPEL

Matthew 9. 18-26

At that time, as Jesus was speaking to the multitudes, behold a certain ruler came up, and adored Him, saying: Lord, my daughter is even now dead; but come lay Thy hand upon her, and she shall live. And Jesus, rising up, followed him, with His disciples. And behold a woman, who was troubled with an issue of blood twelve years, came behind Him, and touched the hem of His garment. For she said within herself: If I shall touch only His garment, I shall be healed. But Jesus turning and seeing her, said: Be of good heart, daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour. And when Jesus was come into the house of the ruler, and saw the minstrels and the multitude making a tumult, He said: Give place; for the girl is not dead, but sleepeth. And they laughed Him to scorn. And when the multitude was put forth, He went in, and took her by the hand. And the maid arose. And the fame thereof went abroad into all that country.
