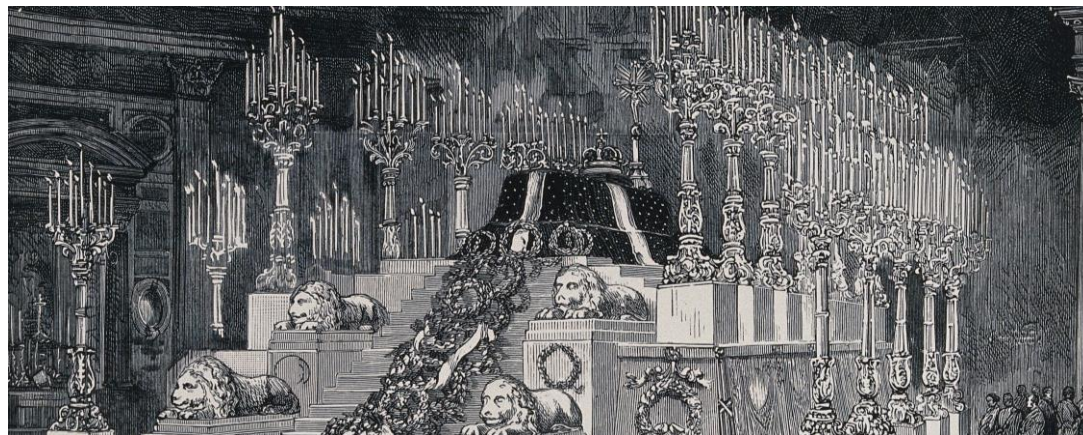

12th November until 19th November 2023



Requiescat in pace

As today is Remembrance Sunday, the Collect and Post communion prayers extend the words 'benefactors of our congregation' to the souls of our country who have fought in conflict, as the whole country has benefitted from their sacrifice.

The catafalque (empty coffin under a black pall) is raised and represents all these souls, as we offer Holy Mass for their repose.

In a Mass for the Dead, the prayers at the foot of the altar are not said as a sign of mourning, similar to the Mass of Passion Sunday, when Our Lord begins His Passion.

Blessings with incense are reserved usually for the Blessed Sacrament only and the body which has been a temple of the Holy Ghost. In today's Mass, there is no blessing of the congregation by incense or at the end of Mass because all prayers are for the deceased. Instead, there will be an absolution of the catafalque which represents the bodies of those who have died.

Pious List: This is a list of names of your dearly departed. Your Canons will place this list on the altar for the duration of November, so that these souls will be helped by the graces from Holy Mass. Please give your list to a Canon.

Grave blessings: We will be blessing Fr Mullins grave in Rake Lane Cemetery **today after 10.30am Mass**. If you have a grave to be blessed there, please book with a Canon and come along.

Your Canons have begun to book grave blessings for your loved ones at Landican, Frankby, or any other local cemetery. Please text a Canon to book.

St Francis de Sales teaching cont.:

"That a beginning must be made by the purgation of the soul."

Purgation: the removal of hindrances of every kind which turn the soul aside from the love of God.

The ordinary purgation and healing, whether of the body or of the soul, is only brought about little by little, by progressing from improvement to improvement, with effort and by slow degrees. The exercise of purgation of the soul cannot, (nor indeed ought it) come to an end, until we die: let us not therefore be troubled because of our imperfections, for our perfection consists in fighting against them and we cannot fight against them if we do not see them, nor conquer them if we do not encounter them. Our victory does not lie in not feeling them but in not consenting to them. The flowers, say the sacred Spouse, (Cant., II, 12) have appeared in our land; the time of pruning is come.

PROPERS of the MASS

24th Sunday after Pentecost: Remembrance Sunday

INTROIT

Eternal rest give to them, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. *Ps.* To You we owe our hymn of praise, O God, in Sion; to You must vows be fulfilled in Jerusalem. Hear my prayer; to You all flesh must come.

COLLECT

O God, the bestower of pardon and lover of man's salvation, we beseech Thy clemency, through the intercession of blessed Mary, ever a virgin, and all Thy saints, that the brethren, kindred, and benefactors of our congregation who have passed out of this world may together enjoy everlasting happiness.

EPISTLE

2 Mach. 12:43-46

In those days: The most valiant man Judas, making a gathering, sent twelve thousand drachmas of silver to Jerusalem for sacrifice to be offered for the sins of the dead, thinking well and religiously concerning the resurrection, for if he had not hoped that they that were slain should rise again, it would have seemed superfluous and vain to pray for the dead; and because he considered that they who had fallen asleep with godliness, had great grace laid up for them. It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins.

GRADUAL

Eternal rest give to them, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. *Ps* The just man shall be in everlasting remembrance; an evil report he shall not fear.

TRACT

O Lord, absolve the souls of all the faithful departed from every bond of sin. *V.* And by the help of Your grace may they be worthy to escape the sentence of vengeance. *V.* And to enjoy all the beatitude of the light eternal.

GOSPEL

John 6:37-40

At that time, Jesus said to the multitude of the Jews, All that the Father gives to Me shall come to Me, and him who comes to Me I will not cast out. For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him Who sent Me. Now this is the will of Him Who sent Me, the Father, that I should lose nothing of what He has given Me, but that I should raise it up on the last day. For this is the will of My Father Who sent Me, that whoever beholds the Son, and believes in Him,

shall have everlasting life, and I will raise him up on the last day.

OFFERTORY

O Lord, Jesus Christ, King of glory, deliver the souls of all the faithful departed from the pains of hell and the deep pit; deliver them from the lion's mouth, that hell engulf them not, nor they fall into darkness, but that Michael, the holy standard-bearer, bring them into the holy light * which You once promised to Abraham and his seed. *V.* We offer You, O Lord, sacrifices and prayers of praise; accept them for those souls whom we this day commemorate; grant them, O Lord, to pass from death to the life * which You once promised to Abraham and his seed.

SECRET

O God, Whose mercy is boundless, mercifully receive the prayers of our lowliness, and grant, through these sacraments of our salvation, to the souls of our brethren, kindred, and benefactors, to whom Thou didst the confession of Thy name, the remission of all sins.

COMMUNION

May light eternal shine upon them, O Lord, with Your Saints forever, for You are kind. *V.* Grant them eternal rest, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them: with Your Saints forever, for You are kind.

POSTCOMMUNION

Grant we beseech Thee, O almighty and merciful God, that the souls of our brethren, kindred and benefactors, for whom we have offered this sacrifice of praise to Thy majesty, being purified of all sins by the virtue of this sacrament, may, by Thy mercy, receive the beatitude of perpetual light.
