

St Francis de Sales teaching cont.:

'Chapters 7-18 Of the second purgation that of the attachment to sin.

From The Introduction to the Devout Life.

You must not only forsake sin, but you must also cleanse your heart from all the affections which are connected with sin; for, besides the danger of a relapse, these affections are a perpetual source of weakness to your spirit, and weigh it down so much that it cannot do good works, readily, diligently and frequently, in which lies the true essence of devotion. (Chpt 8). Therefore we must enlarge our contrition as much as possible, so that it may embrace everything that is connected with sin.

To this end St Francis de Sales prepared a set of ten meditations, which, if well done, will root out of your heart, with the help of God's grace, sin and the principal affections to sin. He suggests taking one each morning and turning it over in our mind during the course of the day. For each meditation start by placing yourself in the presence of God and to asking Him to inspire you. Conclude your time with thanksgiving, offering, petition and Our Father and the Hail Mary. Reflect on what God has inspired in you.

The titles of the daily meditations are:

- 1: creation
- 2: of the end for which we are created.
- 3: the benefits of God
- 4: sin
- 5: death
- 6: judgement
- 7: hell
- 8: paradise
- 9: by way of election and choice of paradise.
- 10: by way of election and choice which the soul makes of the devout life.

All meditations are given in full in Chapters 9-18.

INTROIT

To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *Ps.* Show me, O Lord, Thy ways: and teach me Thy paths. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Stir up Thy power, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: that from the threatening dangers of our sins, by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued, and be saved by Thy deliverance: Who livest and reignest.

EPISTLE

Romans 13. 11-14

Brethren, knowing that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep. For now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. The night is passed and the day is at hand. Let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armour of light. Let us walk honestly, as in the day: not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and impurities, not in contention and envy: but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Luke 21. 25-33

For the powers of heaven shall be moved. And then they shall see the Son of man coming in a cloud with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand. And He spoke to them a similitude: See the fig tree and all the trees: when they now shoot forth their fruit, you know that summer is nigh.
