First Sunday of Advent

St Francis de Sales teaching cont.:

Chapter 19 How to make the general confession.

From The Introduction to the Devout Life.

A general confession is made under the direction of a spiritual director confessing sins of your whole life. However, many of the counsels of Saint Francis de Sales can be transferred to ordinary confession where we reflect on our sins committed since our last confession? Maybe this might help you obtain a plenary indulgence on Friday for the Immaculate Conception? (See back page)

Once you have completed the 10 days of set meditations, then go courageously in the spirit of humility to make your general confession; but pray do not allow yourself to be troubled by any sort of apprehension; sin is shameful when we commit it, but when it is changed into confession and repentance, it is honourable and salutary. If we be truly humble our sins will displease us infinitely because God is offended thereby; but the accusation of our sins will be sweet and agreeable to us, because God is honoured thereby. When you come before your spiritual father, imagine yourself to be on mount Calvary beneath the feet of Jesus Christ crucified, whose precious blood trickles down from all parts to wash you from your iniquities; although it is not the actual blood of the Saviour, it is nevertheless the merit of his blood shed for us, which waters abundantly the penitents around the confessionals. Open your heart wide, then, that the sins may go out by confession; for the more they go out of your heart, the more will the precious merit of the Divine Passion enter in to fill it with blessings. But say everything simply and unreservedly; satisfy your conscience completely in this matter, once and for all. And when you have done so, listen to the advice and admonitions of the servant of God, and say in your heart: Speak Lord for thy servant heareth (Kings 3:9) Yes, it is God, to whom you are listening, since he has said to his representatives: He that heareth you, heareth me (Lk 10:16)

1st Sunday of Advent

INTROIT

To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *Ps.* Show me, O Lord, Thy ways: and teach me Thy paths. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Stir up Thy power, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: that from the threatening dangers of our sins, by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued, and be saved by Thy deliverance: Who livest and reignest.

EPISTLE

Romans 13. 11-14

Brethren, knowing that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep. For now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. The night is passed and the day is at hand. Let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armour of light. Let us walk honestly, as in the day: not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and impurities, not in contention and envy: but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ.

For the powers of heaven shall be moved. And then they shall see the Son of man coming in a cloud with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand. And He spoke to them a similitude: See the fig tree and all the trees: when they now shoot forth their fruit, you know that summer is nigh. So you also, when you shall see these things come to pass, know that the kingdom of God is at hand. Amen, I say to you, this generation shall not pass away

till all things be fulfilled. Heaven and earth shall pass away: but My words shall not pass away.

- 2. Friday is the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady. As she is a patroness of the Institute, you can gain a plenary indulgence for yourself or a Holy Soul, to be free of the punishments of purgatory. The conditions are:
- Attend confession 8 days either side.
- Attend Mass & Holy Communion in an Institute church on the day.
- Pray for the Holy Father.
- Have no attachment to sin, <u>even venial sin</u>.
