

The Feast of the Holy Family

On this day for the last time in the liturgical cycle, the Church invites us to contemplate the mystery of Jesus' humble hidden life. The emphasis is of one typical aspect of the humble life of this hidden God: obedience. From Bethlehem to Calvary, obedience was His companion. St Bernard says, "God obeyed man! Yes, the God to whom the angels are subject... was subject to Mary, and not only to Mary, but also to Joseph. For God to obey a woman is humility without parallel... learn then man to obey; learn O earth to be submissive. God subjected Himself to men; and do you, desiring to rule others, place yourself above your Creator?" "Did you not know that I must be about

My Father's business?" These are the first recorded words in the Gospel, of our humble, gentle Jesus. He spoke them in order to declare His mission and affirm the primacy rights of God. Jesus taught us that God, and the things of God must always come first. He must hold first place in our lives, and we must obey Him regardless of all other considerations, even if it means sacrificing the rights of nature and of blood.

However, this doesn't imply neglecting our duties towards our neighbour. Today's feast calls our attention to these obligations, inviting us to follow the example of the Holy Family of Nazareth, and showing us the virtues of mercy, benignity, humility, modesty and patience, bearing forgiving one another.

It is a traditional practice to write the above inscription on the lintel of one's home with blessed chalk after the Feast of Epiphany. The water and chalk is specially blessed on the vigil of the Epiphany. The letters "CMB" stand for the names of the three magi (Caspar, Melchior, & Balthasar) as well as the abbreviation Christus mansionem benedicat: May Christ bless this house!

PROPERS of the MASS

Feast of the Holy Family

INTROIT

The father of the Just rejoiceth greatly, let Thy father and Thy mother be joyful, and let her rejoice that bore Thee. Ps. How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of Hosts; my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O Lord Jesus Christ, who when Thou wast subject to Mary and Joseph didst sanctify the home life with ineffable virtues: grant that by their assistance, we may be instructed by the example of Thy Holy Family and become partakers of their eternal happiness: Who livest and reignest.

EPISTLE Colossians 3. 12–17

Brethren: Put ye on therefore, as the elect of God, holy, and beloved, the bowels of mercy, benignity, humility, modesty, patience: bearing with one another and forgiving one another if any have a complaint against another. Even as the Lord hath forgiven you, so do you also. But above all these things have charity, which is the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ rejoice in your hearts, wherein also you are called in one body: and be ye thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly, in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms, hymns, and spiritual canticles, singing in grace in your hearts to God. All whatsoever you do in word or in work, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, giving thanks to God and the Father by Him.

GRADUAL

One thing I have asked of the Lord, this will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life. V. Blessed are they that dwell in Thy house, O Lord, they shall praise Thee for ever and ever.

ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Verily, Thou art a hidden God, the God of Israel, the Saviour. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Luke 2.* 42–52

When Jesus was twelve years old, they going up into Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast, and having fulfilled the days, when they returned, the Child Jesus remained in Jerusalem, and His parents knew it not. And thinking that He was in the company, they came a day's journey, and sought Him among His kinsfolk and acquaintance. And not

finding Him, they returned into Jerusalem, seeking Him. And it came to pass that after three days they found Him in the Temple, sitting in the midst of the doctors, hearing them and asking them questions. And all that heard Him were astonished at His wisdom and His answers. And seeing Him they wondered. And His mother said to Him: Son, why hast Thou done so to us? Behold Thy father and I have sought Thee sorrowing. And He said to them: How is it that you sought Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business? And they understood not the word that He spoke unto them. And He went down with them and came to Nazareth and was subject to them. And His mother kept all these words in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and grace with God and men.

OFFERTORY

The parents of Jesus carried Him to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord.

SECRET

We offer to Thee, O Lord, this sacrifice of propitiation, humbly entreating that through the intercession of the virgin Mother of God and blessed Joseph, Thou wouldst firmly establish our families in Thy peace and grace. Through the same our Lord.

COMMUNION

Jesus went down with them and came to Nazareth and was subject to them.

POSTCOMMUNION

Make us, O Lord Jesus, whom Thou dost refresh with Thy heavenly sacraments, ever to follow the example of Thy holy Family, that at the hour of our death the glorious Virgin Mother and blessed Joseph may be near us, and we be found worthy to be received by Thee into Thy eternal dwellings. Who livest and reignest.
