## The First Miracle of Jesus

From *Divine Intimacy* page 138

During the days following the Epiphany, the liturgy recalled Our Lord's baptism in the Jordan, marking the beginning of His apostolate. Similarly, today, His first miracle manifests to the world His glory as the Son of God, and for the first time, we see the Blessed Virgin in her maternal function as mediatrix of all graces. Secure in her knowledge of her Son, Mary was neither dismayed by His apparent refusal nor did she insist on her request. Her humility, consideration of others, faith and trustful abandonment win Jesus. The servants obey Him unquestionably and the miracle takes place. **Can we not learn from this to believe, obey and have recourse to Mary's powerful intercession?**

A miracle more wonderful than this is repeated on our altars daily. Jesus has "kept the good wine until now". It is the precious wine of the Holy Eucharist, inebriating our souls with His Body and Blood.



O Jesus, How good You were to give us Your dear Mother to be the Mother of our spiritual life! I will follow Mary's precious advice and do everything You wish me to do.

With confidence and trust, I lay my needs before You today. My soul is like the waterpots at the feast: full of cold, insipid water of my weakness which I never seem to overcome completely. O Lord, I believe that You can change all this water into the precious wine of Your love, Your grace and Your life. O Lord, take my wretchedness and plunge it into Your heart.

# PROPERs of the MASS

## Second Sunday after the Epiphany

### INTROIT

Let all the earth adore Thee, O God and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Most High. Ps. Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise V. Glory be to the Father.

### COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God who dost govern all things in heaven and earth, mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace all the days of our life. Through our Lord.

### EPISTLE

*Romans 12. 6–16*

Brethren: Having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us: either prophecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth, in doctrine; he that exhorteth, in exhorting; he that giveth, with simplicity; he that ruleth, with carefulness; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, with honour preventing one another: in carefulness not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things but consenting to the humble.

### GRADUAL

The Lord sent His word and healed them: and delivered them from their destruction. V. Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonderful works to the children of men.

### ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Praise ye the Lord, all His Angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

### GOSPEL

*John 2. 1–11*

At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him: They

have no wine. And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them: Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine: and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

### OFFERTORY

Shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, all ye that fear God, and I will tell you what great things the Lord hath done for my soul. Alleluia.

### SECRET

Sanctify, O Lord, the gifts which we offer, and cleanse us from the stains of our sins. Through our Lord.

### COMMUNION

The Lord saith: Fill the waterpots with water, and carry to the chief steward. When the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, he saith to the bridegroom: Thou hast kept the good wine until now. This first miracle did Jesus in the presence of His disciples.

### POSTCOMMUNION

May the operation of Thy power be increased within us; we beseech Thee, O Lord, that being quickened by Thy divine sacraments, we may by Thy bounty, be prepared to receive that which they promise. Through our Lord.
