Liturgy

Abridged extract from Benedict XVI
What is Christianity? The last Writings *Chpt. 2*

In the years following the Second Vatican Council, I became conscious once again of the priority of God and of the Divine Liturgy. The misunderstanding of the liturgical reform that spread widely in the Catholic Church led to an increasing prominence of the aspect of instruction and of one's own activity and creativity. The doings of men almost made us forget the presence of God. In such a situation, it became increasingly clear that the existence of the Church is vitally dependent on the correct celebration of the liturgy and that the Church is in danger when the primacy of God no longer appears in the liturgy and thus in life. The most profound reason for the crisis that upset the Church lies in the eclipse of God's priority in the liturgy. [...] I knew that the true renewal of the liturgy is a fundamental prerequisite for the renewal of the Church

EPISTLE *1 Thessalonians 4. 1-7*

BRETHREN: We pray and beseech you in the Lord Jesus that, as you have received from us, now you ought to walk and to please God, so also you would walk, that you may abound the more. For you know what precepts I have given to you by the Lord Jesus. For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you should abstain from fornication, that every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honour; not in the passion of lust, like the Gentiles that know not God: and that no man overreach nor circumvent his brother in business: be- cause the Lord is the avenger of all these things, as we have told you before and have testified. For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto sanctification: in Christ Jesus our Lord.
