

Easter Sunday is the most excellent day, the happiest in the whole year, because it is the day when "Christ, our Pasch has been sacrificed." The Pascal solemnity resounds with an unmistakable note of triumph; joy for the triumph of Christ, for His victory.

The Gospel shows us the holy women running to the tomb, undeterred by the size of the stone. We too, have a keen desirte to find the Lord; perhaps we have been seeking Him for many years? Precisely because we want to find Him, divine Providence has helped us roll away many stones, by His grace. Nevertheless, the search for God must be maintained during our whole life, diligently and confident of the divine aid.

Lord Jesus, good and gentle Jesus, who deigned to die for our sins and to rise for our justification, I beg You, by your glorious Resurrection, to bring me out of the sepulchre of my vices and sins, so that I may merit a real share in Your Resurrection.

Proper of the Mass for Easter Sunday

From this day until after Pentecost, the Sprinkling Rite, Vidi aquam, for the main Mass on Sundays re-places Asperges me. Vidi Aquam refers to the waters of baptism..

INTROIT

I arose and am still with Thee, alleluia: Thou hast laid Thine hand upon me, alleluia: Thy knowledge is become wonderful, alleluia, alleluia. Ps. Lord, Thou has search- ed me and known Me: Thou knowest my sitting down and my rising up. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O God, who on this day through Thine only-begotten Son hast overcome death and opened unto us the gate of everlasting life; do Thou follow with Thine aid the desires which Thou dost put into our minds and by Thy continual help bring the same to good effect. Through the same Lord.

EPISTLE 1 Corinthians 5, 7-8

Brethren, purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new paste, as you are un-leavened: for Christ our Pasch is sacrificed. Therefore let us feast, not with the old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

GRADUAL

This is the day which the Lord hath made: let us rejoice and be glad in it. V. Give praise unto the Lord, for He is good: for His mercy endureth for ever.

ALLELUIA Alleluia, alleluia. V. Christ our Pasch is sacrificed.

GOSPEL Mark 16, 1-7

At that time, Mary Magdalen, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought sweet spices, that coming they might anoint Jesus. And very early in the morning, the first day of the week, they came to the sepulchre, the sun

being now risen. And they said one to another: Who shall roll us back the stone from the door of the sepulchre? And looking, they saw the stone rolled back. For it was very great. And entering into the sepulchre, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed with a white robe, and they were astonished. Who saith to them: Be not affrighted; ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified: He is risen, He is not here; behold the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples, and Peter, that He goeth before you into Galilee: there you shall see Him, as He told you.

OFFERTORY

The earth trembled and was still when God arose in judgment, alleluia.

SECRET

Accept, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the prayers of Thy people with the oblation of sacrifice; that what we have begun by these Paschal mysteries, may by Thy operation, profit us for a healing remedy unto ever-lasting life. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION

Christ our Pasch is immolated, alleluia: therefore let us feast with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION

Pour forth upon us, O Lord, the Spirit of Thy love, that by Thy loving kindness Thou mayest make to be of one mind, those whom Thou hast fed with these Paschal sacraments. Through our Lord.

Easter Sunday: The Solemnity of Solemnities

From The New Marian Missal

Jesus confounded all His enemies by clothing in glory and splendour that Body which had been the "Victim of the cruelty of Man. Christ's triumph over death is the most conclusive proof of His Divinity and the foundation of our faith: "If Christ had not risen again your faith is vain." (1. Cor. 15)

Eastertide begins at Easter and ends on the Saturday after Pentecost. It is a time of uninterrupted joy and Feasts.

Until Ascension Day, the pascal candle shines in the sanctuary, as a symbol of the visible presence of Our Lord upon earth, and white vestments are used. The joyful repetition of "Alleluia" returns as a sign of joy and peace.
