

Oh Jesus, prepare my heart to receive the Holy Spirit whom you have promised and merited for me.

Preparing us for the Ascension of Our Lord, the Church mentions the coming of the Holy Spirit, using Our Lord's discourse after the Last Supper, consoling his apostles, "for if I go not, the Paraclete will not come to you…"

Only Jesus' death could merit this great gift for us, that the Holy Spirit, the envoy of the Father and the Son, could descend upon the Church, and not until after his Ascension into heaven.

Practically:

- we must fervently prepare our souls for Pentecost, so that the coming of the Holy Spirit will be renewed in us in plenty. Sin must be destroyed in us, as sin is the obstacle to the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.
- We must be convinced that The Holy Spirit always acts on a soul in the state of grace, even if the soul does not perceive it. Always trust The Holy Spirit, even in difficulties, to lead the soul and purify it for union with God.
- As justice and sanctity are only found in Him, the Redeemer, we must invoke the action of the Holy Spirit on the Church to govern and direct her in accomplishing her mission.

Ah eternal Word, tell me, I beg, what prevents the Holy Spirit from accomplishing all His work in the soul?

INTROIT

Sing ye to the Lord a new canticle, alleluia, for the Lord hath done wonderful things, alleluia: He hath revealed His justice in the sight of the Gentiles, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps.* His right hand, and His holy arm, hath gotten Him salvation. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

God, who makest the minds of the faithful to be of one will, grant to Thy people to love that which Thou commandest and desire that which Thou dost promise; that so, among the changing things of this world, our hearts may be set where true joys are to be found. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE James 1. 17-21

Dearly beloved, every best gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no change nor shadow of alteration. For of His own will hath He begotten us by the word of truth, that we might be some beginning of His creature. You know, my dearest brethren. And let every man be swift to hear, but slow to speak and slow to anger. For the anger of man worketh not the justice of God. Wherefore, casting away all uncleanness and abundance of naughtiness, with meekness receive the ingrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. V. The right hand of the Lord hath wrought strength, the right hand of the Lord hath exalted me. Alleluia. V. Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more: death shall no more have dominion over Him. Alleluia.

GOSPEL John 16. 5-14

At that time Jesus said to His disciples: I go to Him that sent Me; and none of you asketh Me: Whither goest Thou? But because I have spoken these things to you,

sorrow hath filled your heart. But I tell you the truth: it is expedient to you that I go; for if I go not, the Paraclete will not come to you: but if I go I will send Him to you. And when He is come, He will convince the world of sin, and of justice and of judgment. Of sin, because they believed not in Me; and of justice, because I go to the Father, and you shall see Me no longer; and of judgment, because the prince of this world is already judged. I have yet many things to say to you: but you cannot bear them now. But when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will teach you all truth. For He shall not speak of Himself: but what things soever He shall hear He shall speak, and the things that are to come He shall show you. He shall glorify Me: because He shall receive of Mine and shall show it to you.

Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, and I will tell you, all ye that fear God, what great things the Lord hath done for my soul, alleluia.

SECRET

O God, who by the sacred intercourse of this sacrifice hast made us partakers of the one supreme divine nature: grant, we beseech Thee, that as we know Thy truth, so we may follow it by a worthy life. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION

When the Paraclete, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will convince the world of sin, and of justice and of judgment, alleluia, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION

Assist us, O Lord our God, that by these gifts which we have received in faith, we may be purified from vice and delivered from all dangers. Through our Lord.
