Dear faithful.

Amidst the challenges of the present time, the large number of vocations to our Institute is a sign of hope and cause for thanksgiving. Six young men have entered our house of formation in Preston, one of whom comes from this apostolate. They will remain until the following July to discern their vocation and prepare for entrance to our seminary, near Florence.

One of our British seminarians is now a deacon, another is in the subdiaconate and each of the earlier years at Gricigliano includes young men from our province.

At the same time, we would be remiss not to mention the recent reception of the black veil by four of our Sister Adorers on the 16th of October and the investitute with the holy habit of three new sisters on the following day, feast of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. Deo Gratias!

A second collection will be held at both Sunday Masses to support the ICKSP Seminary at Gricigliano, in Italy. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

Those who attend Mass in a church or chapel of the ICKSP may obtain a plenary indulgence on the Feast:

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace: (1) have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin; (2) have sacramentally confessed their sins; (3) receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the indulgence only Holy Communion is required); (4) pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

ST PHILOMENA'S WAY

The Diocese of Shrewsbury is promoting a new pilgrimage route called St Philomena's Way as part of a national project to establish walking pilgrimage routes in each of the 22 Catholic dioceses of England and Wales.

The Pilgrim Ways: Hearts in Search of God project aims to provide a pilgrimage route in each of the dioceses, one which starts at the cathedral of the relevant diocese and then ends at a shrine within the same diocese. Walking pilgrimages tend to lead to a humble acceptance of our fragility and transience in this world. In Catholic understanding, pilgrimage is a search for God.

St Philomena's Way starts from the Cathedral of Our Lady Help of Christians & Saint Peter of Alcantara in Shrewsbury and ends here at the Shrine Church of Ss Peter & Paul and St Philomena in New Brighton. The Way passes Shrewsbury Abbey, the remains of Haughmond Abbey, the Shropshire Way to Wen and the Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour, the Church of St George, Whitchurch, along the beautiful Sandstone Trail, the Shropshire Union Canal and follows the Two Saints Way to Chester. After passing the Churches of St Werburgh and St Francis Assisi and Chester Cathedral the Way re-joins the Shropshire Union Canal to the Church of Our Lady, Star of the Sea, Ellesmere Port then on to New Brighton.

FEAST OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING

INTROIT Apocalypse 5. 12, 1-6

The Lamb that was slain is worthy to receive the power and divinity and wisdom and strength and honour: to Him be glory and empire for ever and ever. Ps. Give to the King, O God, Thy judgment, and to the King's Son Thy justice. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Almighty everlasting God, Who in Thy beloved Son, King of the whole world, hast willed to restore all things anew; grant in Thy mercy that all the families of nations, rent asunder by the wound of sin, may be subjected to His most gentle rule. Who with Thee liveth and reigneth.

EPISTLE Col. 1.12-20

Brethren: We give thanks to God, the Father, Who hath made us worthy to be partakers of the lot of the saints in light: Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love. In Whom we have redemption through His blood, the remission of sins; Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature for in Him were all things created in Heaven and on earth visible and invisible, whether thrones, or dominations, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by Him and in Him. And He is before all, and by Him all things consist. And He is the head of the body of the Church, Who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things He may hold the primacy: because in Him it hath well pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell; and through Him to reconcile all things unto Himself, making peace through the Blood of His Cross, both as to the things that are on earth, and the things that are in Heaven, in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

ALLELUIA

GOSPEL. John 18. 33-37

At that time: Pilate said to Jesus: Art thou the King of the Jews? Jesus answered: Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or have others told it thee of Me? Pilate answered: Am I a Jew? Thy own nation, and the chief priests, have delivered thee up to me: what hast thou done? Jesus answered: My kingdom is not of this world.

If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would certainly strive that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now My kingdom is not from hence. Pilate therefore said to him: Art thou a king then? Jesus answered: Thou sayest that I am a King. For this was I born, and for I this came I into the world; that I should give testimony to the truth, Everyone that is of the truth, heareth My voice.

PREFACE FOR THE FEAST OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God Who didst anoint with the oil of gladness Thine only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, eternal Priest and King of the universe: that, offering Himself as a stainless peaceoffering on the altar of the cross, He might fulfil the pledges of man's redemption; and, having all creatures subject to His power, might deliver to Thy sublime majesty an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life; a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace. And therefore with the Angels and Archangels, with the Thrones and Dominations, and with all the array of the Heavenly host, we sing a hymn to Thy glory and unceasingly repeat:

The Lord shall sit King forever. The Lord will bless His people with peace.
