ILLNESS AND ASSISTED DYING

Catechism of the Catholic Church 1500 1501

Many of the saints knew first-hand what it was to suffer, and so they are very sympathetic in interceding for us and obtaining help for us in bearing our physical burdens. [...] St. Augustine advises that it is good to pray for health, but if this prayer isn't granted, we must firmly believe that our illness or affliction will somehow benefit us in the long run. As St John Vianney stated, "At the hour of death, you will see that you have saved more souls by your illness than by all the good works you might have accomplished in health."

"The greatest honour God can do a soul is not to give it much, but to ask much of it." St Therese of Lisieux. As Christians, we want to serve God, but many times we wish to do so on our terms, not on His. Such a desire can actually become a form of stubbornness or pride. St. Francis de Sales notes that for an ill person to desire to minister, serve others, and perform the duties of someone healthy is not only a fruitless wish; it may also cause the person to ignore what God is actually asking – namely that he or she be obedient, patient, and resigned to His will. In other words, we can either 'waste' our illness by rebelling against it, or we can use it to grow spiritually by surrendering ourselves into the Lord's hands. St. John of Avila says, "You may well be content to serve our Lord in illness, for when He calls people to suffer instead of working for Him, He is calling them to a higher state."

When we're sick and unable to perform our regular duties, our job is to pray – not necessarily in a formal way which might be beyond our strength – but in the manner that St. Charles of Sezze describes: "The prayer of the sick person is his patience and his acceptance of the sickness for the love of Jesus Christ. This has the great worth when it is motivated by the imitation of how much He suffered for us, and by penance for our sins."

Labour MP Kim Leadbeater is submitting a proposed bill that will legalise assisted suicide, to be introduced to Parliament on 16 October. We encourage everyone to pray, fast and lobby their MP with all urgency. Many people are at risk from this bill, or might be in the future: the disabled, the elderly, the physically and mentally ill, patients not receiving adequate or timely treatment, and even people who could be coerced by family members. TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT *Esther 13: 9, 10, 11*

All things are in Thy will, O Lord; and there is none that can resist Thy will: for Thou hast made all things, heaven and earth, and all things that are under the cope of heaven: Thou art Lord of all. Ps. Blessed are the undefiled who walk in the way: who walk in the law of the Lord. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O Lord, we beseech Thee, to keep Thy household in continual godliness that, through Thy protection, it may be free from all adversities, and devotedly given to serve Thee in good works to the glory of Thy Name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE. *Ephesians 6: 10-17*

Brethren: Be strengthened in the Lord, and in the might of His power. Put you on the armour of God, that you may be able to stand against the deceits of the devil. For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. Therefore take unto you the armour of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and to stand in all things perfect. Stand therefore having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of justice, and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace in all things taking the shield of faith, wherewith you may be able to extinguish all the fiery darts of the most wicked one. And take unto you the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

GOSPEL *Matthew 18: 23-35*

At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of Heaven is likened to a king, who would take an account of his servants. And when he had begun to take the account, one was brought to him that owed him ten thousand talents: and as he had not wherewith to pay it, his lord commanded that he should be sold, and his wife and children, and all that he had, and payment be made. But that servant falling down,

besought him saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And the lord of that servant, being moved with pity, let him go and forgave him the debt. But when that servant was gone out, he found one of his fellow servants that owed him a hundred pence: and laying hold of him, he throttled him, saying: Pay what thou owest. And his fellow-servant falling down besought him, saying: have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not but went and cast him into prison till he paid the debt. Now his fellow servants, seeing what was done, were very much grieved and they came and told their lord all that was done. Then his lord called him and saith to him: Thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all the debt, because thou besoughtest me; shouldst not thou have had compassion also on thy fellow servant, even as I had compassion on thee? And his lord being angry, delivered him to the torturers, until he paid all the debt. So also shall my Heavenly Father do to you, if you forgive not every one his brother from your hearts.
