While the Gospel show clearly Jesus' divinity and demands on our part an ever greater faith in His divine power, the Collects of this Sunday emphasise our human weakness; they make us implore the help which we need to remain what we ought to be, to sustain our supernatural life and purify us from sin. In the apostles' boat Jesus, by a gesture of His sovereign power, calms the furious waves; His presence in our lives brings with it beace and security.

The Epistle continues to explain St. Paul's teaching on the duties of a Christian. Towards our neighbour they are all contained in the one word, charity; we cannot really love others without keeping the commandments which regulate our relations with them; love of our neighbour means fulfilling the whole of the Law.

### November: The Four Last Things

During this month, the church invites us to meditate upon the four last things: death, judgement, hell and heaven. It is the end of the liturgical year and a perfect time to reflect on time and eternity in view of the Second Coming of Our Lord

To contemporary man, the remembrance of death—*Memento mori*—seems like an unnecessary and gloomy consideration. However, it is essential to our Christian spiritual life, which looks beyond the fleeting joys of the present to eternal beatitude with God. Through the cross, Christ overcame death. Meditation on the Passion of Our Lord and upon the Four Last Things is the best means to take on the sufferings and trials of this life—including illness and death. As you know, we will be continuing the tradition of the blessing of graves. Don't forget that from the 1st to 8th November the church offers a plenary indulgence, applicable to the souls in purgatory, to those who go to a cemetery to pray for the faithful departed. Let us be assiduous in this spiritual work of mercy, with the certitude that the suffering souls will certainly seek to recompense our charity when they appear in the presence of God.
