The Parable of the Mustard Seed

When there are more than 24 Sundays between Pentecost and Advent, Holy Mother Church "resumes" the readings from the Sundays after Epiphany which were omitted. Thus, last week would have been the Gospel of the 5th Sunday after Epiphany, and this Sunday, we have the 6th. Next week is the Proper Mass for the Final Sunday after Epiphany, concluding the liturgical year just prior to the season of Advent. Among these readings we encounter several famous parables, including that of the Mustard Seed.



When we have heard something many times, we can easily cease to take in its meaning. But it is important to approach the Holy Gospel always with fresh eyes and ears. Monsignor Wach, Prior General of the ICKSP, frequently emphasises how small and apparently unimportant our little Institute is within the Church. Nonetheless, if we do God's will, we are always accomplishing enough!

This is also an important lesson for our personal lives. It is easy to feel crushed by circumstances, situations or problems which are much bigger than us. However, God is in charge! He makes use of little, humble instruments to achieve His purposes. It is not by our own merits, skills or virtues, but rather it is by faith that supernatural good is accomplished.

Speaking of the mustard seed (*Granum Sinapis* in Latin), this is the motto we have chosen for our education centre in Preston, Saint Benedict's. For three days per week, I am absent from our lovely apostolate of New Brighton to continue this work of educating our little flock of children. Thus, I am taking the opportunity to ask for your prayers. And if there are any homeschooling families out there interested in visiting sometime, please let me know! EPISTLE *I* Thessalonians 1:2 – 10

Brethren: We give thanks to God always for you all, making a remembrance of you in our prayers without ceasing, being mindful of the work of your faith and labour and charity, and of the enduring of the hope of our Lord Jesus Christ before God and our Father: knowing, brethren beloved of God, your election: for our Gospel hath not been unto you in word only, but in power also, and in the Holy Ghost, and in much fullness, as you know what manner of men we have been among you for your sakes. The Presentation Of The Blessed Virgin Mary November 21st

After having solemnized on September 8th the Nativity of the blessed Virgin, and four days later the feast of the Holy Name of Mary, a name given to her a short time after her birth, the cycle celebrates on this day the Presentation in the temple of the child of benediction. These first threes feasts of Mary's cycle are an echo of the Christological cycle which likewise celebrates the birth of Jesus, December 25th, the imposition of His Holy Name, January 2nd, and His Presentation in the temple, February 2nd. The feast of the Presentation of Mary is founded on a pious tradition, originated by two apocryphal gospels which relate that the Blessed Virgin was presented in the temple of Jerusalem when three years old, and that she lived there with other girls and the holy women who had them in their care. Already in the sixth century the event is commemorated in the East and the Emperor Michael Comnenus alludes to it in a constitution of 1166.
