Remembrance Sunday

This week we celebrate Remembrance Sunday with the Anniversary Requiem Mass. It is an opportuni to continue our meditation on the Last Things, and to exercise one of the spiritual works of mercy, praying for the dead. This is the best way for us to repay the debt of gratitude owed to them. Love of country is linked to the virtue of piety. Today, it is fashionable to denigrate everything which came before us, but despite the faults and sins of our ancestors, we must recognize that so many of the goods we experience have been handed down to us, without any merit on our part.

In the struggles of the present time, it is also immensely useful to remember the suffering of previous generations. Considering those who persevered under the extreme conditions of war, we can put our own problems into perspective. The *Hail Holy Queen* reminds us that this life is a vale of tears—the service members we honour passed through that vale with admirable courage and virtue.

Finally, as we celebrate the Requiem Mass, we invite you to pay close attention to the particularities of this beautiful liturgy. At the beginning of the Mass, Psalm 42 which is an expression of joy, is suppressed, rendering the Mass more austere. The exuberant chant of the alleluia is replaced with a tract, as in Lent. Furthermore, the magnificent piece known as the *Dies Irae* is added prior to the Gospel, in the form of a Sequence.

Throughout the liturgy, many blessings normally given are removed: the priest makes the sign of the cross over the Missal and not himself at the Introit, there is no blessing for the minister reading the epistle and gospel, likewise the water at the offertory and the servants after Mass do not receive the customary benediction—all blessings are reserved to the dead. This is also why the priest will omit the sign of the cross over the people immediately before the Last Gospel.

At the Agnus Dei, the words dona nobis pacem are replaced with dona eis requiem (sempiternam). In the same way, the Ite Missa est is replaced with Requiescant in pace. Following the High Mass, the ceremony of the absolution will take place. A catafalque is constructed in front of the sanctuary, representing the faithful departed. The choir sings the Libera me and the dead are blessed with the sacramentals of holy water and incense, with prayers for their release from the punishments of purgatory. Requiem aetemam dona eis Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis!



Adoration for Life: The Bishops of England and Wales will be praying a holy hour before the Blessed Sacrament this Wednesday, 13th November at 5:30pm to pray for the defeat of the bill to legalise assisted suicide. INTROIT 4 Esdr. 2:34,35

EPISTLE. II Machabees 12:43 - 46

In those days: The most valiant man Judas, making a gathering, sent twelve thousand drachmas of silver to Jerusalem for sacrifice to be offered for the sins of the dead, thinking well and religiously concerning the resurrection (for if he had not hoped that they that were slain should rise again, it would have seemed superfluous and vain to pray for the dead); and because he considered that they who had fallen asleep with godliness, had great grace laid up for them. It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins.
