Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus

Dear faithful,

The time following Christmas is very rich in liturgical celebrations. This Sunday, we contemplate the power of the Holy Name of Jesus ("Yehoshua" –God saves) given to the Christ child through the message of the Archangel Gabriel. Tomorrow, is the great feast of the Epiphany or *manifestation* of Our Lord. In Western Christianity, this feast recalls primarily the visit of the Magi from the east, but it is also linked to the baptism of Our Lord and his first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana.

The celebration of Our Lord's baptism gave rise to the solemn blessing of Epiphany water, which

will take place here at the hour of Sunday evening Vespers. The Mass of Our Lord's Epiphany will be at the usual time tomorrow, 6:30pm.

This coming Saturday, 11th January, at 10am, we have the joy of a very special event! Canon Morrow, ordained earlier this year, will celebrate a first Solemn Mass here at the Dome in the presence of our **Bishop**, **His Lordship**, **Mark Davies**. Afterward, there will be the customary first blessings of a new priest, with possibility of a **plenary indulgence**. Please do everything possible to attend this wonderful occasion!

INTROIT Phil 2:10-11

At the Name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth, and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father. Ps 8:2 O Lord, our Lord, how glorious is Your Name over all the earth. P. Glory be to the Father....

PREFACE

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God, for through the Mystery of the Word made flesh, the new light of Thy glory hath shone upon the eyes of our mind, so that while we acknowledge God in visible form, we may through Him be drawn to the love of things invisible. And therefore, with Angels and Archangels, with Throne and Dominations, and with all the hosts of the heavenly army, we sing the hymn of Thy glory, evermore saying:

COMMUNION Ps 85:9-10

All the nations You have made shall come and worship You, O Lord, and glorify Your Name. For You are great and do wondrous deeds; You alone are God. Alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION

Almighty, eternal God, You Who have created and redeemed us, graciously look upon our needs, and deign to receive with kind and favourable countenance the sacrifice of the Saving Victim, which we have offered to Your majesty, in honour of the Name of Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, that, Your grace being poured out upon us, we may have the joy of seeing our names written in heaven, under the glorious Name of Jesus, the sign of eternal predestination. Through the same Jesus Christ, thy Son, Our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth.

At the name of Jesus every knee should bend. Jesus! Saviour! This is the meaning of the most holy name. Because it is the name given to the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity in His human nature; because it is the beloved name of the Son of God, because its very meaning suggests the whole of the mystery of redemption, because of the miraculous power hidden in that holy name – for all these reasons, Saint Paul says in his epistle to the Philippians: "At the name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father"[...]

And every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father. The Holy Name of Jesus comes directly from God, so we are told in the inspired pages of the Scripture (Lk 2:21) [...]

I will give thanks to you O Lord my God, with all my heart, and I will glorify your name forever (Off.) The sentiments of adoration and thanksgiving found in the Offertory prayer should be the fruits of my mediation on the Holy Name of Jesus.

Resolution: To honour the Holy Name of Jesus in some special way this day.
