Fifth Sunday after Epiphany

This Sunday, Our Lord proposes to us the famous parable of the wheat and the tares. Like all parables, it is important for us to read it closely, paying attention to the details especially when they are surprising. One of these details is the nature of the "tares" or "cockle" which Our Lord refers to. This is not simply any weed, but a form of grass which looks very much like wheat until the plants come to fruition. Thus, the parable helps us see more clearly the mystery of the Church, wherein the good and evil are frequently mixed together and indistinguishable—until the time of judgement.

This year, the 5th Sunday after Epiphany is also the last. Next week, we begin the season called *Septuagesima* or Pre-Lent. It consists of three weeks where the Sunday and ferial Masses are in violet, in anticipation of Lent. Since we need to prepare in order to do anything well, this liturgical period is a great opportunity to consider carefully our resolutions for Lent and what is needed to put them effectively into practice.

Saint Blaise – Blessing of throats

The faithful may receive the throat blessing of Saint Blaise, following the 10.30am Sung Mass today.



But while men were asleep, his enemy came and oversowed cockle among the wheat and went his way. And when the blade was sprung up and had brought forth fruit, then appeared also the cockle. And the servants of the good man of the house coming, said to him: Sir, didst thou not sow good seed in thy field? Whence then hath it cockle? And he said to them: An enemy hath done this. And the servants said to him: Wilt thou that we go and gather it up? And he said: No, lest perhaps, gathering up the cockle, you root up the wheat also together with it. Suffer both to grow until the harvest, and in the time of the harvest I will say to the reapers: Gather up first the cockle and bind it into bundles to burn, but the wheat gather ye into my barn.
