SEPTUAGESIMA

Doctrinal Note

After the fervent welcome given to our Lord by reason of "the glory of God in the face of Christ Jesus" the Church suddenly confronts us with the gloomy depths of the fall of man. As in the Christmas cycle, the great figures who heralded the redemptive work of Christ—and whose history is symbolical of our Lord's—are well calculated to prepare us for the great feast of Easter when we shall celebrate His triumph. "Search the scriptures," said our Lord, "the same are they which give testimony of me."

Lex gravida Christo—the Old Law is quite full of the thought of the Messiah, for in everything connected with God's people our Lord was foretold and proclaimed. The Old Testament is like a gospel anticipated, lighting up with peculiar brilliance our Redeemer's life. The Church loves to set up a constant parallel in her liturgy between the first and last pages of the Bible. The parallelism is followed up though the whole of Septuagesima and Lent and we shall find it once more, and very clearly, in the Time after Pentecost.

Liturgical Note

The Septuagesima season always begins with the ninth week before Easter and includes three Sundays called respectively Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima. (These names denote not the week but the period of ten days during which each of these Sundays falls; in Latin it is expressed more accurately as Dominica *in* Septuagesima and *in* Quinquagesima.) Lent is known in Latin as Quadragesima.

PROPER of the MASS SEPTUAGESIMA SUNDAY

INTROIT Psalm 17. 5, 6, 7

The sorrows of death surrounded me, the sorrow of hell encompassed me: and in my affliction I called upon the Lord, and He heard my voice from His holy Temple. Ps. I will love Thee, O Lord, my strength: the Lord is my firmament, my refuge, and my deliverer. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Graciously hear, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the prayers of Thy people, that we who are justly afflicted for our sins, may be mercifully delivered by Thy goodness, for the glory of Thy name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE 1 Corinthians 9. 24-27; 10. 1-5

Brethren: Know you not that they that run in the race, all run indeed, but one receiveth the prize? So run that you may obtain. And every one that striveth for the mastery refraineth himself from all things: and they indeed that they may receive a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible one. I therefore so run, not as at an uncertainty; I so fight, not as one beating the air: but I chastise my body, and bring it into subjection, lest perhaps when I have preached to others, I myself should become a castaway. For I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all in Moses were baptized, in the cloud and in the sea: and did all eat the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink: (and they drank of the spiritual rock that followed them: and the rock was Christ). But with most of them God was not well pleased.

And going out about the third hour, he saw others standing in the marketplace idle, and he said to them: Go you also into my vineyard, and I will give you what shall be just. And they went their way. And again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour: and did in like manner. But about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing, and he saith to them: Why stand you here all the day idle? They say to him: Because no man hath hired us. He saith

to them: Go you also into my vineyard. And when evening was come, the lord of the vineyard saith to his steward: Call the labourers and pay them their hire, beginning from the last even to the first. When therefore they were come that came about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. But when the first also came, they thought that they should receive more: and they also received every man a penny. And receiving it they murmured against the master of the house, saying: These last have worked but one hour, and thou hast made them equal to us that have borne the burden of the day and the heats. But he answering said to one of them: Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst thou not agree with me for a penny? Take what is thine and go thy way: I will also give to this last even as to thee. Or, is it not lawful for me to do what I will? Is thy eve evil, because I am good? So shall the last be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen.
