### First Sunday of Lent

Today, Holy Mother Church presents us with the Gospel of the three temptations with which the devil attempted to defeat Christ: to turn stones into bread, to worship Satan in exchange for power, and to make a vain miraculous display by throwing himself from the pinnacle of the temple. We can see in these temptations the triple concupiscence mentioned by Saint John: "For all that is in the world, is the concupiscence of the flesh, and the concupiscence of the eyes, and the pride of life, which is not of the Father, but is of the world" (1 John 2:16).

The enemy attempts to overcome us through disordered relationships with created goods: goods of the body, goods of the soul, or material goods that are external to us. These disorders produce the seven deadly sins. Concerning the body: gluttony, lust and sloth. Concerning the soul: anger, envy and pride. Concerning material goods: avarice. The resolutions during Lent which are the most valuable are those which help us remove these obstacles to our relationship with God.

Remember to keep in your prayers the Holy Father, Pope Francis, who remains hospitalized with pneumonia.

Within the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, it is customary to say the prayer for the Pope—

Oratio Pro Papa—after the normal collects of the Mass. The translation is as follows:

O God, Shepherd and Ruler of all Thy faithful people, look mercifully upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast chosen as shepherd to preside over Thy Church. Grant him, we beseech Thee, that by his word and example, he may edify those over whom he hath charge, so that together with the flock committed to him, he may attain everlasting life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen

#### \*Terminally ill adults (End of Life) Bill

On 29<sup>th</sup> November 2024, MPs voted 330 to 275 in favour of Kim Leadbeater MP's Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill. MPs will have another chance to vote on this at its third reading - probably in April and if enough MPs change their minds, then the Bill will be defeated.
