Second Sunday of the Passion - Palm Sunday

Dear faithful,

A blessed Palm Sunday to all of you! Today begins the week of weeks, the holiest time of the year in which we commemorate the great works of Our Blessed Saviour in the Redemption and Recreation of the world.

Originally, two Masses were celebrated on this Sunday, one celebrating the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, the other commemorating the Passion according to Saint Matthew. The two were eventually combined, giving us our present ceremony. In the Low Mass, the Passion is read and the entrance into Jerusalem serves as the Last Gospel. We hope you will be able to join us for the procession, which is also an important witness of our faith to the outside world! If you attend the Low Mass, you may come to the church anytime during the week to get your blessed palms. For the special ceremonies of Holy Week, we have bilingual booklets available. If you do not possess a traditional Missal, please make use of these in order to better understand and enter into the extraordinary richness of these rituals.

Please note the extra confession times during the Holy Triduum (Thursday, Friday & Saturday). Holy Mother Church requires of every Catholic to make at least one confession per year and to receive Holy Communion during Eastertide (this is called the Paschal duty). Take this opportunity to be spiritually ready to receive Our Lord.

Each morning during the Holy Triduum, we will sing the special office of Tenebrae at 8.30. Tenebrae consists of psalms, prophecies and other readings which reveal how Our Lord fulfilled all that had been predicted about the Messiah ahead of time.

Finally, there are the great evening liturgies of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. May this week be a special time of spiritual renewal for all of us.

EPISTLE Epistle: Philippians 2. 5-11

Brethren: yours is to be the same mind which Christ Jesus showed. His nature is, from the first, divine, and yet He did not see, in the rank of Godhead, a prize to be coveted; He dispossessed Himself, and took the nature of a slave, fashioned in the likeness of men, and presenting Himself to us in human form; and then He lowered His own dignity, accepted an obedience which brought Him to death, death on a cross. Then Pilate commanded that the body should be delivered. And Joseph taking the body wrapt it up in a clean linen cloth, and laid it in his own new monument, which he had hewed out in a rock. And he rolled a great stone to the door of the monument and went his way. And there was Mary Magdalen and the other Mary, sitting over against the sepulchre.

And the next day, which followed the day of preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees came together to Pilate, saying: "Sir, we have remembered that that seducer said, while He was yet alive: After three days I will rise again. Command therefore the sepulchre to be guarded until the third day, lest perhaps His disciples come and steal Him away and say to the people: He is risen; and the last error shall be worse than the first."
