5th SUNDAY AFTER EASTER & THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

Dear faithful,

This week there are two special liturgical celebrations. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday prior to the Ascension are the traditional "Rogation Days" in which the Litany of the Saints is sung while going in procession before the Mass. Historically, in rural areas this was also accompanied by the blessing of fields and crops. Join us to pray to heaven for all of our needs and intentions. Note carefully that the procession will begin at 6pm with the Mass following immediately afterwards.

This Thursday, 29th May, is the Feast of Our Lord's Ascension into heaven. This is one of the great Christological celebrations of the year — coming 40 days after the Resurrection, it concludes the Saviour's earthly ministry. After the Gospel of the Mass, the Paschal candle is extinguished, representing the physical departure of Christ. We will have a Sung Mass at the usual time of 6.30pm. Please note that this is a Holy Day of Obligation in England and Wales.

Our Lord does not leave us orphans after His Ascension, promising us another Paraclete (a Greek word meaning "advocate"). Thus, we prepare for the great feast of Pentecost, the 50th day after Easter. The time of nine days between these two feasts is the first and greatest novena, and the origin of this Catholic devotion.
