Dear faithful,

The beautiful month of May is also the month consecrated to Mary: O Mary! we crown thee with blossoms today, Queen of the Angels, Queen of the May. Following the sung Mass, we will therefore have the procession in Our Lady's honour with the traditional crowning.

Different parts of the year remind us of different aspects of her maternal care. The present time, falling within paschaltide, invites us to join in the rejoicing of the Blessed Virgin at the Resurrection of her Son. These sentiments are also beautifully expressed in the Marian Antiphon, Regina Caeli, which replaces the Angelus. If you do not know how to sing the Regina Caeli, you might follow along with the Holy Father, who sang it for the first time as Pope Leo XIV last Sunday. This Sunday, we will of course be praying for Our Lady's special protection over him as he celebrates the Papal Coronation Mass.

Our Lady is also the Spouse of the Holy Ghost, who conceived the Son of God in her virginal womb. This reminds us of her role in bringing the Spirit more profoundly into our lives. The Scriptures present the Mother of Christ there at the beginning of the Church, praying in preparation for Pentecost: "All these were persevering with one mind in prayer with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren" (Acts 1, 14). We should renew our devotions at this time, praying for Holy Mother Church and seeking through the Blessed Virgin the gifts of the Holy Ghost.
