Sunday after the Ascension

Dear faithful,

We find ourselves today on the Sunday which falls between the great feasts of the Ascension and Pentecost. It is the novena of preparation for the coming of the Holy Ghost.

Through this gift, we are consecrated to the Holy Trinity, this is why Saint Paul writes: "Know you not, that your members are the temple of the Holy Ghost, who is in you, whom you have from God; and you are not your own" (1 Corinthians 6.19).

Along with this personal indwelling, the Holy Ghost also gives seven particular gifts. Their purpose is to *supernaturalise* all of our works. Instead of acting according to purely human modes of behaviour, we are able to be moved and guided by the divine life in us. These seven gifts are:

Fear of the Lord, which restrains us from sin through due reverence to the Heavenly Father.

Piety, which inspires us to acts of religion and devotion, encouraging us towards a divine life.

Knowledge, which helps us see the truth of things in spiritual terms, the value of God's grace and the ugliness of sin.

Fortitude, by means of which we have the strength to overcome the obstacles in the spiritual life.

Counsel, which fortifies our practical intellect to choose the right means to salvation and to avoid the deceits of the world and the devil.

Understanding, enabling us to penetrate the mysteries of the faith which surpass human reasoning.

Wisdom, which directs and unites all of our actions for the greater honour and glory of God.

The sev'n-fold gifts of grace are Thine, O Finger of the Hand Divine; True Promise of the Father Thou, Who dost the tongue with speech endow.
