### **External Solemnity of Corpus Christi**


Dear faithful,

Today is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday after Pentecost. The Low Mass at 8.30am will be celebrated in green (readings may be found in the leaflets in the back of the church) while the sung 10.30am Mass will be the Corpus Christi Mass in white. Both Masses are united by the theme of the Holy Eucharist. In the former Mass, we have the striking parable of the great supper. In the latter, the bread of life discourse from St. John's Gospel.

Following the 10:30 Mass, we will proclaim our Eucharistic faith with a procession. Perhaps a particular intention we might all hold close to our hearts would be to pray for the young men who will soon be ordained for Institute. On Monday, 30<sup>th</sup> June, young seminarians will receive the cassock. Tuesday, the 1<sup>st</sup> of July, is the conferral of minor orders. Wednesday will see the ordination of subdeacons and deacons, and Thursday, six young men will be made priests forever, including one from our apostolate in Preston. Deo Gratias!

Peter and Paul (29<sup>th</sup> June): This year, we look forward to the visit of Canon William Hudson, who will celebrate the Sunday Mass at 10.30 for his 25<sup>th</sup> jubilee of priesthood. #### COLLECT

O God, Who in this wonderful sacrament has left us a memorial of Thy passion: grant us, we beseech Thee, so to venerate the sacred mysteries of Thy Body and Blood, that we may ever perceive within us the fruit of Thy redemption. Who livest.

#### EPISTLE 1 Corinthians 11. 23-29

Brethren, I have received of the Lord, that which also I delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread, and giving thanks, broke, and said: Take ye and eat, this is My Body which shall be delivered for you; this do for the commemoration of Me. In like manner also the chalice, after He had supped, saying: This chalice is the new testament in My Blood; this do ye, as often as you shall drink, for the commemoration of Me. For as often as you shall eat this bread and drink this chalice, you shall show the death of the Lord until He come. Therefore whosoever shall eat this bread, or drink of the chalice of the Lord unworthily, shall be guilty of the Body and the Blood of the Lord. But let a man prove himself; and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of the chalice. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drink eth judgment to himself, not discerning the Body of the Lord.
