The Feast of Ss. Peter & Paul commemorates their martyrdom in Rome during the persecution of Nero after the great fire of AD 64. St Peter was granted his request to be crucified upside down, as he considered himself unworthy to die in the same manner as Our Lord. Being a Roman citizen, Saint Paul had the privilege of being beheaded, as crucifixion was forbidden by Roman law as a punishment for its citizens.

Feast of Ss. Peter and Paul: Today we are blessed by the visit of Canon William Hudson, who will celebrate the 10.30am Solemn Mass in thanksgiving for his 25th jubilee of priesthood. Canon Hudson was instrumental in laying the foundations for the Institute's apostolate throughout England. We would not exist without his great work and dedication! Happy anniversary, Canon, and thank you! Visit of the Sister Adorers and Collection: For this special occasion, we will also be joined by our dear Sister Adorers who will sing the Mass. The annual second collection for the Sister Adorers of the Royal Heart of Jesus will be held during the Mass. We thank you in advance for your generosity!

ICKSP Ordinations: The coming week is a very special one for our seminarians who will be receiving holy orders at our Church of Ss. Michael and Cajetan in Florence, Italy.

Monday: First year seminarians will receive the cassock, while the future deacons will be incardinated into the Institute, making them full members.

Tuesday: The seminarians who received the cassock on the previous day will now be tonsured. In this ceremony, the bishop cuts their hair in five places in the form of a cross and welcomes them to the clerical state. Other seminarians will receive the minor orders of porter, lector, exorcist (following the present *Code of Canon Law*, this ministry can only be *exercised* by a priest with the mandate of his bishop) and acolyte.

Wednesday: Young men will be ordained to the major orders of sub-deacon and deacon.

Thursday: Ordinations to the Sacred Priesthood!

Friday: First Masses of the new priests in the seminary chapel.

The Penny Catechism Chapter 2 Faith continued;

- 13. What are the chief things which God has revealed? The chief things which God has revealed are contained in the Apostles' Creed.
- 14. The Apostles' Creed I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven ad earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord; Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended into Hell, the third day He rose again from the dead, He ascended into Heaven, sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost; the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen
- 15. How is the Apostles' Creed divided? The Apostles' Creed is divided into twelve parts or articles.

FIRST ARTICLE OF THE CREED

- **16. What is the first article of the Creed?** The first article of the Creed is, "I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth."
- 17. What is God? God is the supreme spirit, who alone exists of Himself, and is infinite in all perfections.
- 18. Why is God called Almighty? God is called "Almighty" because He can do all things: "With God all things are possible." (Matt 19:26)
- 19. Why is God called Creator of heaven and earth? God is called "Creator of heaven and earth" because He made heaven and earth, and all things, our of nothing, by His word.
- **20.** Had God any beginning? God had no beginning: he always was, He is and He always will be.
- 21. Where is God? God is everywhere
- 22. Does God know and see all things? God knows and sees all things, even our most secret thoughts.

INTROIT Acts 12. 11

Now I know in very deed, that the Lord hath sent His angel, and hath delivered me out of the hand of Herod, and from all the expectation of the people of the Jews. *Ps.* Lord, Thou hast proved me and known me: Thou hast known my sitting down and my rising up. Glory be to the Father.

EPISTLE Acts 12. 1-11

In those days, Herod the king stretched forth his hand to afflict some of the Church: and he killed James, the brother of John, with the sword; and seeing that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to take up Peter also. Now it was in the days of the azymes: and when he had apprehended him, he cast him into prison, delivering him to four files of soldiers to be kept, intending after the Pasch to bring him forth to the people. Peter therefore was kept in prison; but prayer was made with- out ceasing by the Church unto God for him. And when Herod would have brought him forth, the same night Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains; and the keepers before the door kept the prison. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood by him, and a light shined in the room; and he striking Peter on the side, raised him up, saying: Arise quickly. And the chains fell off from his hands; and the angel said to him: Gird thyself, and put on thy sandals. And he did so. And he said to him: Cast thy garment about thee, and follow me. And going out, he followed him: and he knew not that it was true which was done by the angel; but he thought he saw a vision. And passing through the first and the second ward, they came to the iron gate that leadeth to the city, which of itself opened to them; and going out, they passed on through one street, and immediately the angel departed from him. And Peter coming to himself, said: Now I know in very deed that the Lord hath sent His angel, and hath delivered me out of the hand of Herod, and from all the expectation of the people of the Jews.
