What is Vespers? Vespers is the official evening prayer of the Catholic Church (cf. Evensong in the Church of England). It consists of five Psalms taken from within Ps. 109-147, followed by a passage of scripture, a hymn and the *Magnificat* (song of praise) of Our Lady. It concludes with the collect prayer for the feast, mystery or saint of the day. It is often followed by benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

# The Penny Catechism SECOND ARTICLE OF THE CREED continued:

- *42. Is there only one person in Jesus Christ?* There is only one Person in Jesus Christ, which is the Person of God the Son

- 43. Why was God the Son made man? God the Son was made man to redeem us from sin and hell, and to teach us the way to heaven.
- *44.* What does the holy name of Jesus mean? The holy name JESUS means Saviour. (Matt.1:21)
- **45.** What the the name Christ mean? The name CHRIST means Anointed.
- 46. Where is Jesus Christ? As God, Jesus Christ is everywhere. As God made man, He is in heaven, and in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar.

#### EPISTLE Romans 6. 3-11

Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His Resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ve be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin, He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God; in Christ Jesus our Lord.
