Pope Leo XIV has confirmed St John Henry Newman is soon to become a Doctor of the Church

"Cor ad cor loquitur"

Newman was canonized in 2019 by Pope Francis, who, in the encyclical *Dilexit nos*, explained why the English cardinal had chosen as his motto the phrase *Cor ad cor loquitur*—"Heart speaks to heart." Because, the Pope noted, beyond any dialectical argument, the Lord saves us by speaking from His heart to ours: "This realization led him, the distinguished intellectual, to recognize that his deepest encounter with himself and with the Lord came not from his reading or reflection, but from his prayerful dialogue, heart to heart, with Christ, alive and present. It was in the Eucharist that Newman encountered the living heart of Jesus, capable of setting us free, giving meaning to each moment of our lives, and bestowing true peace." *Source Vatican News*
