Dear friends, Thanks to your payers and support this year I will begin the my fifth year of formation at seminary.

The formation at the seminary is a minimum of seven years, comprising of a first year of initial introduction to the studies and to the life of seminary followed by two years of philosophy and four years of theology. Our life at seminary is centred first and foremost on the sacred Liturgy, of which the heart is the Holy Mass. The Holy Mass being at the heart and summit of our day, we prolong the divine praises also by the chant of the Divine Office. After prayer and the Liturgy the second most important aspect of seminary life are the studies which we do under the patronage and guidance of Saint Thomas Aquinas. Our studies consist of around six hours each weekday. The



third aspect of our day to day life is that of work, for we seek to live according to the maxim of another of our Patrons Saint Benedict, "Ora et labora" or "pray and work".

How may you help?

The seminary fees are around £7,000 per year; this contributes towards our tuition fees, food, accommodation and more. We, as seminarians, are asked to raise what we can to go towards these expenses.
