## Faith Formation at the Dome of Home

This week we would like to especially highlight the ways in which you can strengthen your Catholic faith at Ss. Peter and Paul & St. Philomena.

▲ Catechism for catechumens and beginners: For anyone wishing to learn more about the Catholic Faith or considering reception into the church/baptism. Newcomers are welcome to join the class in progress! It is not necessary to have attended all previous classes in order to participate. Bring a friend. Classes will be held twice per month.

Next class is Saturday, 13<sup>th</sup> September at 11am, following the 10am Mass. We will continue our exposition of the Apostles' Creed with the doctrine on the Holy Ghost.

Monthly Liturgy Class: Explanation of the gestures and rites of Holy Mass. Next class: Friday 26<sup>th</sup> September at 7.15pm. This class is open to everyone. It is not necessary to have attended previous classes to join now.

First Communion: We will soon begin our next catechism for children making their First Communion. Please contact Canon Post (07856 720 900 or <u>canon.post@icksp.org.uk</u>) to register. Children who are baptised and at least six years old are eligible.

Confirmations (please respond rapidly!) Children and adults who have not received this beautiful sacrament should also notify Canon Post and register for preparation. The sacrament will be conferred here at the Dome on Saturday, 25<sup>th</sup> October at 3pm.

- What is the first Thursday devotion? You are probably aware of the first Friday devotions in honour of the Sacred Heart and the first Saturday devotions in honour of Our Lady. The first Thursday is kept in honour of the priesthood of Our Lord and to pray for His ordained ministers. Thursday is particularly linked to the Eucharist and the Priesthood because of the institution of these sacraments during the Last Supper, prior to the Passion of Jesus Christ on Good Friday.
- The epistle reading from the votive Mass for Thursday highlights the vocation to the sacred priesthood as described by St Paul in the Epistle to the Hebrews. The gospel reading is the narrative of the Last Supper.

At the Dome, the first Thursday of each month is marked by an extended period of adoration, open to the public from 2pm until just prior to the 6.30pm Mass. Unless it falls on a feast day of higher rank, the Mass celebrated is the votive Mass described above. The next first Thursday devotion will be the  $2^{nd}$  of October.

## THE PENNY CATECHISM: THE EIGHTH ARTICLE OF THE CREED

- 77. What is the eighth article of the Creed? The eighth article of the Creed is, "I believe in the Holy Ghost."
- 78. Who is the Holy Ghost? The Holy Ghost is the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity.
- 79. From whom doth the Holy Ghost proceed? The Holy Ghost proceeds from the Father and the Son.
- 80. Is the Holy Ghost equal to the Father and to the Son? The Holy Ghost is equal to the Father and to the Son, for He is the same Lord and God as they are.
- 81. When did the Holy Ghost come down on the Apostles? The Holy Ghost came down on the Apostles on Whitsunday in the form of "Parted tongues, as it were, of fire." (Acts 2:3)
- 82. Why did the Holy Ghost come down on the Apostles? The Holy Ghost come down on the Apostles to confirm their faith, to sanctify them, and to enable them to found the Church.

#### INTROIT Psalm 73. 20, 19, 23

Have regard, O Lord, to Thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor: arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause, and forget not the voices of them that seek Thee. Ps. O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end: why is Thy wrath enkindled against the sheep of Thy pasture V. Glory be to the Father.

#### COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God, grant unto us an increase of faith, hope and charity: and that we may obtain what Thou dost promise, make us love that which Thou dost command. Through our Lord.

#### EPISTLE Galatians 3. 16-22

Brethren: To Abraham were the promises made, and to his seed. He saith not: And to his seeds, as of many; but as of one, and to thy seed, which is Christ. Now this I say, that the testament which was confirmed by God, the law which was made after four hundred and thirty years, doth not disannul, to make the promise of no effect. For if the inheritance be of the law, it is no more of promise. But God gave it to Abraham by promise. Why then was the law? It was set because of transgressions, until the seed should come, to whom He made the promise; being ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator. Now a mediator is not of one: but God is one. Was the law then against the promises of God? God forbid. For if there had been a law given, which could give life, verily justice should have been by the law. But the Scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by the faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe.
