# **Exaltation of the Holy Cross**

This Sunday, we celebrate the great feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The feast commemorates the discovery of the True Cross by the Empress St Helena and its adoration or 'exaltation' by the faithful in the newly constructed Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre (335 AD). The date gained further reknown when the True Cross was later lost, then recaptured by the Emperor Heraclius and replaced in the holy basilica.

The penitential ember days of September traditionally are observed Wednesday, Friday and Saturday the week following the Feast of the Exaltation.

# March for Life 6th of September

Our day began with 6am Mass at the Dome. The Introit that morning was 'Let us come with confidence to the throne of Grace, that we may obtain mercy and may find Grace for a timely help' which set us up for the day. We prayed the Rosary on the coach and the through the streets of London in our peaceful, prayerful witness to the sanctity of human life. The speakers were excellent – see YouTube. The event concluded with us kneeling in prayer in Parliament Square while the Bishop of Clifton conveyed a Papal Blessing on all present. It was a long but blessed day and a privilege to be there. He humbled Himself, becoming obedient even unto death, even to the death of the cross. For which cause God also hath exalted Him, and hath given Him a Name which is above all names: [All kneel] that in the Name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in Heaven, on earth, and under the earth and that every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father.
