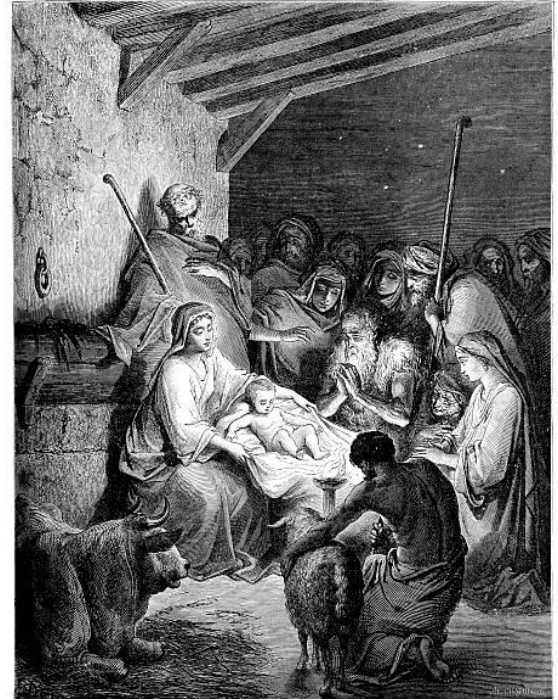
Dear faithful,

Upcoming liturgical services

✠ **Monday, 29th December**, is the Feast of St. Thomas of Canterbury, which is 1st class in England. The Mass time is as usual.

✠ Adoration & Confession is available at the usual time of **5.30pm** during the week. Come spend some extra time with Our Lord during the holidays.

✠ Note that **New Year's Eve, Wednesday 31st**, there will be a special time of Adoration from **9pm to Midnight**. This is a good opportunity to give thanks to God for the blessings of the year. The *Te Deum*, traditional hymn of thanksgiving, will be sung prior to Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The faithful who attend may receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions.

✠ *The Veni Creator Spiritus*, hymn of invocation to the Holy Ghost, will be sung prior to the Mass of New Year's Day.

✠ Next Sunday is the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus.

✠ **Tuesday, 6th January** is the Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord. This is a holy day of obligation in England and Wales. A holy day of obligation entails the same requirement of Mass attendance as a Sunday.

✠ **Epiphany House Blessings:** The Roman Ritual contains three rites for the blessing of a house: one throughout the year, one during Paschaltide, and one for Epiphany. The Epiphany blessing is a particularly solemn blessing in honour of the visit of the Magi to the home of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The priest sprinkles the house with holy water and incenses it and traditionally marks the threshold with blessed chalk. The rite may be performed from 5th January until 1st February.

Canons Montjean and Post will offer the house blessing during the month to come. Please let us know early if you wish to have your house blessed. Those who make their request earlier and those who have never had their house blessed will be given precedence. Due to the diversity of places in which our faithful live, we will seek to group house blessings together by region and area.

THE PENNY CATECHISM

How many Commandments are there?

1. I am Yahweh your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall have no gods except me. PROPER of the MASS – First Sunday in the Octave of Christmas

INTROIT *Wisdom 18. 14-15*

While all things were in quiet silence, and the night was in the midst of her course, Thine almighty Word, O Lord, leaped down from heaven from Thy royal throne. Ps. The Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hath girded Himself. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O almighty and everlasting God, direct our actions according to Thy good pleasure; that in the Name of Thy beloved Son we may deserve to abound in good works: Who with Thee liveth and reigneth.

EPISTLE *Gal. 4. 1-7*

Brethren, as long as the heir is a child, he differeth nothing from a servant, though he be Lord of all: but is under tutors and governors until the time appointed by the father: so we also, when we were children, were serving under the elements of the world. But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent His Son, made of a woman, made under the law, that He might redeem them who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. And because you are sons, God hath sent the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying: Abba, Father. Therefore now he is not a servant, but a son; and if a son, an heir also through God.

GRADUAL *Psalms 44. 3, 2*

Thou art beautiful above the sons of men: grace is poured abroad in Thy lips. V. My heart hath uttered a good word, I speak my words to the king: my tongue is the pen of a scrivener, that writeth swiftly.

ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. V. The Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hath girded Himself with might. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Luke. 2. 33, 40*

At that time Joseph and Mary the mother of Jesus were wondering at those things which were spoken concerning Him. And Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His Mother: Behold, this child is set for the fall, and for the resurrection of many in Israel: and for a sign which shall be contradicted: and thine own soul a sword shall pierce, that out of many hearts thoughts may be revealed. And there was one Anna a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser: she was far advanced in years, and had lived with her husband seven years from her virginity. And she was a widow until fourscore and four years: who departed not from the temple, by fastings and prayers serving night and day.
