

# Gaudete Sunday

Dear faithful,

Gaudete is the Latin verb rejoice – an invitation extended to all of us as Christmas rapidly approaches. Penitential violet is replaced with rose vestments, flowers return to the altar and the organ again accompanies the Mass. We have special reason to rejoice as we prepare for the baptism of three catechumens and the reception

of five candidates into the Catholic Church. Remember to consult carefully the Christmas holiday schedule on page two of the newsletter. Note in particular the extra hours of confession that will be offered. May God bless you and your families during this sacred season!

# THE PENNY CATECHISM

- 158. Should we ask the Angels and Saints to pray for us? We should ask the Angels and saints to pray for us, because they are our friends and brethren, and because their prayers have great power with God.
- 159. How can we show that the Angels and Saints know what passes on earth? We can show that the Angels and Saints know what passes on earth from the words of Christ: 'There shall be joy before the Angels of God upon one sinner doing penance."
- 160. What is the chief prayer to the Blessed Virgin which the Church uses? The chief prayer to the Blessed Virgin which the Church uses is the Hail Mary.
- 161. Say the Hail Mary. Hail, Mary, full of grace; the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

- **162.** Who made the first part of the Hail Mary? The Angel Gabriel and St Elizabeth, inspired by the Holy Ghost, made the first part of the Hail Mary.

And he answered: No. They said therefore unto him: Who art thou, that we may give an answer to them that sent us? What sayest thou of thyself? He said: I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness, Make straight the way of the Lord, as said the Prophet Isaias. And they that were sent were of the Pharisees. And they asked him, and said to him: Why then dost thou baptize; if thou be not Christ, nor Elias, nor the Prophet? John answered them, saying: I baptize with water: but there hath stood one in the midst of you, whom you know not. The same is He that shall come after me, who is preferred before me: the latchet of whose shoe I am not worthy to loose. These things were done in Bethania, beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing.


