The Most Holy Name of Jesus

4th - 11th January 2026



Sunday – Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus

✠ **Epiphany Water Blessing:** [Monday 5th January](#), Eve of the Epiphany, the Solemn blessing of Epiphany water will replace the normal time of Adoration and Confession at 5.30pm.

✠ **The Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord** is [Tuesday, 6th January](#). This is a holy day of obligation in England and Wales. A holy day of obligation entails the same requirement of Mass attendance as a Sunday. The other holy days of obligation for England and Wales are Christmas, the Ascension of Our Lord, Ss. Peter and Paul (29 June), the Assumption of Our Lady (15 August) and the Feast of All Saints (1 November).

Did you know? The feast of the Epiphany and the season immediately following commemorate three great manifestations or ‘Epiphanies’ of Our Lord. These are represented in the depiction above: the miraculous star and the visit of the Magi, the miracle of the wedding feast of Cana, and the baptism of Our Lord. The solemn blessing of water is particularly linked to Our Lord’s baptism in the Jordan, which also has its own feast on 13th January.

For your information, the text of the final blessing: Bless, O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, and thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord.

✠ **Epiphany House Blessings:** The Roman Ritual contains three rites for the blessing of a house: one throughout the year, one during Paschal tide, and one for Epiphany. The Epiphany blessing is a particularly solemn blessing in honour of the visit of the Magi to the home of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The priest sprinkles the house with holy water and incenses it and traditionally marks the threshold with blessed chalk. The rite may be performed from 5th January until 1st February.

Canons Montjean and Post will offer the house blessing during the month to come. Please let us know early if you wish to have your house blessed. Those who make their request earlier and those have never had their house blessed will be given precedence. Due to the diversity of places in which our faithful live, we will seek to group house blessings together by region and area.

THE PENNY CATECHISM

175. What is the first Commandment? The first Commandment is, 'I am the Lord thy God, who brought thee out of the land of Egypt, and out of the house of bondage. Thou shalt not have strange gods before Me. Thou shalt not make to thyself any graven thing, nor the likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or in the earth beneath not of those things that are in the waters under the earth. Thou shalt not adore them nor serve them.'

176 What are we commanded to do by the first Commandment? By the first Commandment we are commanded to worship the one, true and living God, by Faith, Hope, Charity, and Religion.

177. What are the sins against Faith? The sins against Faith are all false religions, wilful doubt, disbelief, or denial of any article of Faith, and also culpable ignorance of the doctrines of the Church.

178 How do we expose ourselves to the danger of losing our Faith? We expose ourselves to the danger of losing our Faith by neglecting our spiritual duties, reading bad books, going to non-Catholic schools, and taking part in the services or prayers of a false religion.

In those days, Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said, Rulers of the people and elders, if we are on trial today about a good work done to a cripple, as to how this man has been cured, be it known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that in the Name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, Whom you crucified, Whom God has raised from the dead, even in this Name does he stand here before you, sound. This is 'The stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone.' Neither is there salvation in any other. For there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved.
