


Third Sunday after Epiphany

Dear faithful,

Today we celebrate already the final 'green Sunday' after Epiphany. Next week is Septuagesima, the beginning of Lent in violet in the old liturgical calendar of the Latin Mass, followed on Monday by Candlemas.

Thursday is the feast of Saint Francis de Sales, one of the patrons of Our Institute. We are fortunate to be able to celebrate a Sung Mass on this occasion. We hope you will be able to join us! St. Francis is at the heart of our spirituality. The priests of the ICKSP recommend in particular to the faithful the doctrine of his *Introduction to the Devout Life*, which is a kind of manual of holy living for the lay faithful. If you are unfamiliar with it, we encourage you to discover this extraordinary spiritual treasure!

Through Our Lord Jesus Christ Who lives and reigns with Thee and the Holy Ghost, God world without end, Amen."

PENNY CATECHISM continued

184. Is it forbidden to give divine honour or worship to the Angels and Saints? It is forbidden to give divine worship to the angels and Saints, for this belongs to God alone.

185. What kind of honour or worship should we pay to the Angels and Saints? We should pay to the Angels and Saints and inferior honour or worship, for this is due to them as the servants and special friends of God.

186. What honour should we give to relics, crucifixes and holy pictures? We should give to relics, crucifixes and holy pictures a relative honour, as they relate to Christ and His Saints, and are memorials of them.

187. Do we pray to relics or images? We do not pray to relics or images, for they can neither see, nor hear nor help us.

188. What is the second commandment? The second Commandment is, 'Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.'

189. What are we commanded by the second Commandment? By the second Commandment we are commanded to speak with reverence of God and all holy persons and things and to keep our lawful oaths and vows.

190. What does the second Commandment forbid? The second Commandment forbids all false, rash, unjust and unnecessary oaths; as also blaspheming, cursing and profane words.

191. Is it ever lawful to swear or to take an oath? It is lawful to swear, or to take an oath, only when God's honour, or our own, or our neighbour's good requires it.

INTROIT *Psalm 96. 7-8*

Adore God, all you His Angels: Sion heard, and was glad: and the daughters of Juda rejoiced. *Ps.* The Lord hath reigned, let the earth rejoice: let many islands be glad. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Almighty and eternal God, mercifully look upon our infirmity, and stretch forth the right hand of Thy majesty to help and defend us. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE *Romans 12. 16-21*

Brethren: Be not wise in your own conceits. To no man rendering evil for evil: providing good things not only in the sight of God, but also in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as is in you, have peace with all men. Revenge not yourselves, my dearly beloved, but give place unto wrath. For it is written: Revenge is mine: I will repay, saith the Lord. But if thy enemy be hungry, give him to eat; if he thirst, give him to drink: for doing this, thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head. Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil by good.

GRADUAL *Psalm 101. 16-17*

The Gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord, and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. *V.* For the Lord hath built up Sion: and He shall be seen in His glory.

ALLELUIA *Psalm 96. 1*

Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* The Lord hath reigned, let the earth rejoice: let many islands be glad. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Matthew 8. 1-13*

At that time, when Jesus was come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed Him: and behold a leper came and adored Him saying: Lord, if Thou wilt, Thou canst make me clean. And Jesus, stretching forth His hand touched him, saying: I will. Be thou made clean. And forthwith his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus saith to him: See, thou tell no man: but go, show thyself to the priest, and offer the gift which Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them. And when He had entered into Capernaum, there came to Him a centurion, beseeching Him, and saying: Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, and is grievously tormented. And Jesus saith to him: I will come and heal him. And the centurion making answer said: Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldst enter under my roof: but only say the word and my servant shall be healed. For I also am a man subject to authority, having under me soldiers; and I say to this: Go, and he goeth; and to another: Come, and he cometh; and to my servant: Do this, and he doeth it. And Jesus hearing this marvelled and said to them that followed Him: Amen
